But even as the 300 undergraduates and 200 alumni began to arrive, two national leadership groups were concluding pre-Karnea meetings. First on the scene had been the Arch Chapter. Later, 16 members of the Undergraduate Council met to discuss topics concerning all 114 Delt chapters. They elected Jim Adams of Louisiana State University to preside. Then the two groups met together.

By the time their sessions reached adjournment Tuesday afternoon, Aug. 12, activities at the lobby registration desk were building to a crescendo.

Wednesday morning's opening session kicked off a four-day series in which the Fraternity's major policy decisions would be established for the next biennium. After delegates introduced themselves in the opening roll call, reports from Fraternity officers provided a composite of happenings during the past two years.








For the first day's luncheons, delegates were divided according to Divisions, with each Division president serving as a host. It was a good chance to get acquainted and discuss mutual concerns, as well as enjoy the food from a spectacular buffet.

An open session in the afternoon examined chapter and house concerns, with Former President Herb McCracken presiding. The topic of legal challenges was presented by John W. Wood, Jr., South Dakota '68, Minneapolis attorney and former Northern Division president, and Emil Narick, Pittsburgh '40, judge of the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas. Ohio State University Coordinator of Greek Affairs Barbara J. Tootle kept her audience laughing, but also thinking, in her discussion of "Booze and Brotherhood". Fraternity President Kenneth Folgers struck a note that became an unofficial theme of the Karnea with his discussion of the Fraternity's anti-hazing leadership. Afterwards, delegates broke into small groups to discuss the various subjects.



Wednesday evening, at Three Rivers Stadium, attention was turned to the Pittsburgh Pirates vs. the New York Mets, with the entire Karnea attending as guests of Pirates owner John W. Galbreath. Mr. Galbreath served as honorary co-chairman of the Karnea, with Mr. McCracken. A. J. "Bud" Murphy was chairman of the Karnea Planning Committee.

On Thursday morning, it was back to Karnea business. Division scholarship awards were presented by James Rockwell, director of academic affairs, to the University of Virginia, Albion College, the University of Pittsburgh, and the University of Nebraska. Syracuse University and the University of Idaho received discretionary awards for creating outstanding scholarship projects in 1979-80. Idaho was represented again at the podium when Richard Lierz read his winning entry in the biennial Karnea undergraduate essay contest. His full text is presented on page 20.

At the traditional Leadership Luncheon, Delts displayed their interfraternity spirit by welcoming as speaker a Sigma Chi alumnus, the incomparable W. W. "Woody" Hayes, former Ohio State football coach. He was introduced by his close friend, Mr. Galbreath.





Leadership seminars filled the afternoon agenda. Seminar topics and leaders were: "Chapter Leadership & Motivation", Bryan Flanagan of Sigma Chi; "Principles of Fund Raising", Tosier Brown, past president of NIC, Joseph B. Leckie, W & J '50, and Paul J. Franz, Jr., Lehigh '45; "Issues in the Ritual", members of the Committee on Ritual Review; "Small Campus Rush", Fred C. Tucker III, DePauw '69; "Medium Campus Rush", Richard H. Englehart, Indiana '45; "Large Campus Rush", Thomas F. Calhoon, II, Ohio State '70; "Pledge Education with No Hazing", Jeffrey S. Heatherington, Willamette '65, and Gale Wilkerson, Oklahoma State '66; "Inflation Fighting and Energy Saving", Joseph C. Wiener, Illinois Tech '74, and Dr. John H. Venable, Oklahoma State '51. Strategy booths in the lobby were open between sessions during the entire Karnea. They served as sounding boards for the exchange of new ideas on public relations, rush, and academic incentives.







Friday, Aug. 15, brought a Karnea pilgrimage to the Fraternity's restored birthplace, the Founders House at Bethany College. Twelve bus-loads of Delts made the 50-mile trip to take part in an academic processional, followed by a special college convocation, a luncheon, model initiation, tour of the Founders House, and a steak cook-out. Arrangements for the inspiring day-long series were made by Bethany College.

At the convocation, David A. Blaner, president of Theta Chapter at Bethany, presented the dedication of the day. Delt Perry E. Gresham, president emeritus of Bethany College, presented the convocation address, excerpted on page 18.

Then Bethany College President Todd H. Bullard conferred honorary degrees on four outstanding members of the Fraternity: John W. Nichols, Oklahoma '36, Doctor of Business Administration; G. Herbert McCracken, Pittsburgh '21, doctor of Education; John W. Galbreath, Ohio '20, Doctor of Humanities; and Edwin L. Heminger, Ohio Wesleyan '48, Doctor of Journalism.

Mr. Heminger, vice-chairman of the Founders House Committee, presided at a luncheon in the Bethany College Commons. Mr. McCracken presented the Litany of Dedication, and Thomas H. Smith, Kent State '58, spoke about the founders. Dr. Smith created the concept for displays in the Founders House.

The model initiation in Bethany Chapel was conducted by a team from Gamma Sigma Chapter, University of Pittsburgh. Another team from Carnegie-Mellon's Delta Beta Chapter gave the Rite of Iris. Afterwards, Delts and guests toured the Founders House, recently completed with displays on the first and second floors. In the evening they enjoyed the hospitality of Bethany College hosts at the campus cook-out, combining good eating with bluegrass music entertainment.







Other officers elected by the delegation are Vice-President and Ritualist the Rev. Grover "Tex" McElyea, Ohio Wesleyan '47, Second Vice-President Donald G. Kress, Lafayette '58; Treasurer David L. Nagel, Iowa State '63; Secretary Wayne A. Sinclair, West Virginia '68; and Director of Academic Affairs R. James Rockwell, Jr., Cincinnati '59. Jeff Heatherington was appointed by President Folgers to complete the term of Mr. Nagel as Western Division president. Division presidents are elected in off-Karneia years by their individual Division Conference delegations.

Alumni Achievement Awards

Charles E. Bancroft
Miami '50

After graduating from Miami University, Charles Bancroft entered the insurance business in the underwriting department of a company in his home town of Mansfield, Ohio. Since then, his insurance career has taken him to Texas, California, Illinois, and back to California, where for the past 13 years he has been president, chief executive officer and a member of the board of the California Mutual Insurance Co., based in Monterey. He also is chairman of the board and chief executive officer of American Eagle Insurance Co., and president and chief executive officer of Monterey Financial Corp.

Hoyt D. Gardner
Westminster '46

During the 22 years he has been in the private practice of general surgery in Louisville, Ky., Dr. Hoyt Gardner has shared his knowledge and experience in many ways. He is an associate clinical professor of surgery at the University of Louisville, where he received his own medical degree, and he has held top positions regularly with numerous professional, educational, and political organizations at city, county, state, and national levels. This year, his dedication to serving has culminated in one of the country's most prestigious roles: president of the American Medical Association.

Henry K. Allen
Texas '47

In March of 1978, Henry Allen was sworn in as first vice-president and vice-chairman of the Board of Directors of the Export-Import Bank of the United States, the Government agency that assists in financing the nation's export sales. Appointment to that high-ranking post was the most recent highlight of a career that has included such other positions as chairman and chief executive officer of three Texas banking institutions: Temple National Bank in Temple, Farmers & Merchants State Bank in Ballinger, and the First State Bank in Rogers. He also has been an officer and board member of First International Bancshares of Dallas.

Richard M. Boesen
DePauw '29

For many years, Richard Boesen was the only American citizen licensed to practice law in Peru. Today, he has a thriving law practice in Lima, with assignments taking him to many parts of the world. Meanwhile, he has written four books on Peruvian laws regarding foreign investment. A member of Phi Beta Kappa at DePauw and a graduate of the Boston University School of Law, Mr. Boesen practiced in Chicago and on the East Coast before joining the Navy in World War II. While serving at the Naval Air Training Station in Jacksonville, Fla., he became interested in the Spanish language, prompting him to pursue further studies later in Mexico City and Peru, then open the law practice in Lima.

Samuel M. Harrell
Wabash, Pennsylvania '52

As chairman and chief executive officer of Early & Daniel Industries, Indianapolis, Samuel Harrell represents his family's fourth generation involved in building the grain marketing company to \$630 million in annual sales, 75 percent of which is exporting Midwestern corn, soya beans, and wheat to foreign nations. He also heads the company's three subsidiaries, General Grain of Indianapolis, Tidewater Grain of Philadelphia, and the Early & Daniel Co. celebrating its 100th year in Cincinnati. He recently was named to the Board of Overseers of Wharton School of Finance, University of Pennsylvania, his alma mater.



Robert B. Hunter
Washington '40

As president-elect of the American Medical Association, Dr. Robert Hunter soon will accept the presidential gavel from Dr. Hoyt Gardner. It will be in good hands. Dr. Hunter received his M.D. from the University of Pennsylvania, then interned at Buffalo General Hospital. His general practice of surgery at Sedro Woolley, Wash., has been supplemented with academic, professional, military, and community service. He is a charter member of the American Board of Family Practice, and has served on the faculty of the University of Washington School of Medicine. He also is on the staff of United General Hospital in Sedro Woolley.

James A. Jerome
Toronto '54

Associate Chief Justice of the Federal Court of Canada James Jerome holds one of the most important government service positions on this continent. Before accepting that appointment earlier this year, he had served more than five years as speaker of the House of Commons. During nearly 12 years as a member of Parliament, he held a series of special appointments and elections: member of a Committee on Procedure, vice-chairman of the Standing Committee on Privileges and Election, chairman of the Special Committee on Election Expenses, and Parliamentary secretary to the president of the Privy Council. He was elected speaker of the House of Commons in 1974.

William M. Laub
UCLA & California, Berkeley '46

President and chief executive officer of Southwest Gas Corporation, headquartered in Las Vegas, William Laub heads an organization that has grown from modest beginnings to one employing more than 1,000 persons serving customers in three states. As a board member of First National Bank of Nevada, he also has been involved for 15 years with the rapid growth of that institution, which has reached nearly \$2 billion in total resources. Mr. Laub received his L.L.B. from California's School of Jurisprudence, and practiced law in Los Angeles from 1951 to 1955. He has been a Republican national committeeman for Nevada since 1968.

Paul G. Miller
Purdue '44

A high school graduate at the age of 15, Paul Miller received degrees from Purdue, MIT and the U.S. Naval Academy. As a Naval test pilot, he gained experience in modern control systems, putting that knowledge to work later with Daystrom Corp. in California after leaving the Navy in 1957. By 1961 he was general manager of Daystrom's Control Systems Division. Two years later he was named to a similar position with Control Data Corp. when the Minnesota organization purchased Daystrom. When Commercial Credit Co. became a wholly owned subsidiary of Control Data in 1975, Mr. Miller was named president and chief operating officer. Last year he was elected chairman and chief executive officer of Commercial Credit, with main offices in Baltimore, Md.

John H. Perkins
Northwestern '43

In the 34 years he has been in the banking business, John Perkins has risen from a trainee with Continental Bank in Chicago to become one of the nation's financial leaders. He was formally recognized as such two years ago when he was elected president of the American Bankers Association. Currently he is chairman of that group's Advisory Council. Mr. Perkins is president of Continental Illinois Corp. and its principal subsidiary, Continental Illinois National Bank and Trust Co. of Chicago. He has been called upon often to serve on committees working closely with the U.S. Treasury Department and with advisory groups for the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve.

James L. von Harz
Purdue '38

Since 1974, James von Harz has served as group general manager of International Telephone and Telegraph Corporation Components, North America, a position with responsibilities for several major facilities in the U.S. and Canada. Last year he was given additional leadership of all ITT Cannon Electric plants, including England, Germany, and France, and major distributor operations in Belgium and Italy. He also was elected a corporate vice-president of ITT. Another recent achievement is being a founder and director of a connector assembly and sales joint-venture organized by ITT Cannon Electric and Japan Aviation Electronics.

DELTA TAU DELTA, like other social fraternities, was founded on the campus of an educational institution. Fellowship, fun and mutual assistance have been dominant themes. In more recent years, Delta Tau Delta has given more emphasis to learning. When Robert Hartford wrote the history of the Fraternity, he began by showing areas of similarity between Delta Tau Delta and the first Greek letter fraternity, Phi Beta Kappa.

Today the Delts have met to tell the world in this highly symbolic language of academia that every chapter of Delta Tau Delta is an educational institution. John Henry Newman, in his *Idea of a University*, correctly pointed out that students learn more from each other than they do from the teachers. Every chapter house is a learning center. To be sure, not as educationally oriented as the university colleges of Oxford and Cambridge, nor yet as specifically and narrowly oriented toward high marks as Phi Beta Kappa, but nevertheless, each Delt chapter is a learning center and many of the things learned are worthy to keep and cherish.


On this historic day, when Delts from all over the world come back to this secluded campus, the major emphasis of this worldwide fellowship is subsumed under a trilogy. The world has never forgotten the good, the true and the beautiful of ancient Greece. Today the Delta Tau Delta trilogy is learning, leadership and loyalty.

Wherever people gather, leaders emerge. Every chapter is a leadership center where some lead and others follow. There can be no leaders without

followers and there can be no followers without leaders. Robert Greenleaf has rediscovered something as old as the Bible when he found the image of a leader in a concept of a servant. When all evidence is in, the person who serves best is the leader, whether or not he has the title.

Delts have achieved the highest offices in both public and private life. They have entered the government in the

executive, legislative and judicial branches. They have molded and administered the corporate life of America. They have brought luster to medicine, law, letters, art and teaching. The chapter house played an important role in all of this.

Daniel Sommers Robinson was the world's authority on Josiah Royce. This distinguished Californian became a celebrated professor of philosophy at Harvard. Under the spell of Robinson's teaching, Josiah Royce, great philosopher of loyalty, came alive once more. Royce saw loyalty to "The Great Community" as the supreme goal of all human living.

The human tendency is for our loyalty to be too small. The Kentucky lad meant well when he said he would die for Paducah High, but this was hardly the best investment of a life. Community loyalty is fine; state loyalty adds interest; national loyalty, called patriotism, is essential for the survival of nation states, but loyalty for "The Great Community" includes loyalty to God, man and the universe without limitation of time and space. Exclusive loyalty to this little planet can be provincial, for there are wheeling systems out beyond.

The loyal Delt loves his chapter and his Fraternity, but he knows full well that there are commitments above and beyond. This return to Bethany after 122 years is a pilgrimage. The meaning of this pilgrimage is loyalty to "The Great Community". No Delt is a complete Delt unless his knowledge and dedication transcend his Fraternity.

I call each Delt to mount up with wings as eagles. This visit to Bethany is a renewal of strength that will enable each of us to soar above the difficulties, treasons and misfortunes of our time. Delts are not chickens, but eagles.

DELTA Tau Delta's International President attended college in the slums of Chicago. At least those were the surroundings of Illinois Institute of Technology in the mid-1950s when he was a student.

"If you had the window open while you were studying, your work was interrupted regularly by sounds of sirens, shouting and even gunfire," Ken Folgers recalls. "Hold-ups on the campus averaged one a day."

Mr. Folgers was stopped once himself by a knife-wielding hold-up man, obviously completely under the influence of drugs. Looking at his victim's six-foot-three size, however, the assailant threatened to stab one of Folgers' friends unless he handed over nine cents. Mr. Folgers dropped the money on the street and went on.

Despite its location, IIT had an excellent academic reputation. It was recommended as being particularly strong in architecture, and that was the career Ken Folgers intended to pursue.

A native Chicagoan, he grew up in Cicero, where his father made a living putting roofing and siding on older homes in the area. Dutch ancestry on both sides of the family is reflected in Mr. Folgers' blond hair and blue eyes.

The elder Folgers expanded his business somewhat into remodeling homes and small stores, apparently sparking his son's interest in architecture. This influence was supplemented at Oak Park High School where Ken had a teacher who had become a published architectural photographer of Frank Lloyd Wright buildings, several located in the Oak Park area. It was that teacher who suggested IIT as the best school for architecture, even though Mr. Folgers had considered attending college farther from his home city.


Beginning as a commuter student in 1953, IIT being primarily a streetcar school at that time, Mr. Folgers quickly discovered that social life centered on fraternities. He went through rush, was offered three bids, and made what he loyally describes as "an easy choice" during his first semester.

Gamma Beta Chapter was just starting a period of rejuvenation at that time. In fact, Mr. Folgers remembers that pledges outnumbered actives his first year. Consequently, his pledge class moved quickly into leadership roles.

The house was an enormous old mansion with marble fireplaces, grand

staircases, wood paneling, a third-floor ballroom converted into a dormitory for nearly 60 men, and a huge basement vault that could accommodate all members as a chapter room. It even had inner and outer doors. A new house has been constructed since then.

Although he never held a major office, Mr. Folgers was guide for several years and served as chairman of many committees. He also attended Division Conferences and the 1956 Houston Karnea. Gamma Beta hosted a Regional Conference.

Because architecture was a five-year curriculum, Mr. Folgers became the "grand old man" of the chapter in 1957-58. He was president of the Senior Class and active in campus politics. By then he also was working part-time with the architectural firm of Skidmore, Owens & Merrill.

Having attended college on a Naval ROTC scholarship, Mr. Folgers received his commission on a Thursday in June of 1958. On Friday he was graduated from IIT and on Saturday he married Virginia "Ginger" Kickert, whom he had dated all through college. They had been friends since childhood, when they attended the same church.

Ensign Folgers' first assignment was in Hawaii, where he and Ginger moved after a one-month honeymoon through the West. Later his ship (USS Brister) operated out of Guam, so the couple moved there. With them was their first son, Kent.

Out of the Navy in 1961, Mr. Folgers side-stepped a guaranteed job with Skidmore to join a former instructor with C. F. Murphy Associates in designing the Chicago Civic Center. It proved to be a day-and-night job for two years.

When he had more time, he again became active in Gamma Beta as chapter adviser, attending Division Conferences as part of that assignment. Two years later, he became a Northern Division vice-president, at the invitation of Division President Edwin H. Hughes, III. At the Division Conference in 1971, Mr. Hughes asked him to run for president, since he had completed his second term in office.

"I knew that was a tremendous time-consuming responsibility, so I called Ginger and we discussed it," says Mr. Folgers. "She supported the idea, I was elected, and suddenly I found myself

Building Brotherhood Without Hazing

*The Fraternity's winning essay
offers concrete plans for
solving a long-time problem.*

"I believe in Delta Tau Delta for the education of youth and the inspiration of maturity . . ."

THESE ARE familiar words to all Delts. They are the words to our own creed. It is a verse which is repeated thousands of times each year by Delts across the continent. They are words we profess to believe in. Admirable words. Noble words. Words which speak of the greatness of our Fraternity. Yet, each year this same great Fraternity is defiled and degraded by hazing.

The practice of hazing is not new, and the problems arising from it are varied. The criminal and civil legal liabilities are great, and the increasing number of legal actions being taken against fraternity chapters for hazing-related problems indicates the seriousness of this matter.

Yet the problems of hazing go far beyond legalities. A far more reaching problem is one that does not involve physical injury or harm. It is that hazing destroys brotherhood; the same brotherhood that it is supposed to foster and build.

One of the most used justifications for hazing is that it

builds brotherhood through unity. When one steps back, however, and compares this justification with the ideals expressed in our creed, one finds a contradiction. Does hitting a pledge inspire maturity? Does humiliating a college freshman educate him? I think not. I think that it is hypocrisy to believe in the ideals of our Fraternity and continue to practice hazing.

Hazing may indeed create unity within a pledge class, but it is forced unity. The pledges are degraded, made to feel inferior, and humbled. They draw, from each other, the strength to overcome the abuses heaped upon them by the

initiates of the chapter. But, this unity does not infer brotherhood. On the contrary, this type of unity destroys brotherhood. The pledges are segregated from the rest of the chapter until they become a separate entity. The chapter itself is not united in one brotherhood, but is separated into four distinct groups — one for each pledge class.

A pledge education program should not have this result as its goal. Rather, a good pledge education program should strive to educate the class. It should help the class grow together with the rest of the chapter, so that at the time of initiation the entire chapter is united in one brotherhood.

This, admittedly, is a goal not easily attained, but it is impossible when hazing is incorporated in the pledge education program.

The first step in building a Delt brotherhood without hazing is the hardest. The chapter must face its own hazing problem head-to-head. Once members have come to terms with their

problem, they must commit to change. This commitment involves eliminating some old traditions that are not easy to part with.

But, if the members are truly committed to change, they will realize that old traditions are not necessarily best for the chapter. They can then concentrate on forming new, positive traditions that foster a better brotherhood.

To build a good brotherhood, a chapter needs a good pledge education program. To devise a good program, a good Pledge Education Committee is necessary.

The Committee should be comprised of men from each class. This wide representation helps keep the entire chapter active and informed in this, the most important of chapter functions. Once the Committee is formed, it needs to meet often and regularly to create a program that works for its particular chapter.

No Backsliding

Careful attention must be shown to be certain new acts of hazing don't slip into the new program. To gauge the presence of hazing one only needs to ask, "Does this act really build a better Delt?" When answered objectively this test will outrule acts of hazing.

When devising the pledge education program, the Committee should use the resources of the committee members. A group of college men that put their heads together can arrive at many new, workable programs that fulfill the goals of the pledge education process.

A Big Brother program is a good place to start. By developing a quality Big Brother program that encompasses all aspects of the chapter, instead of just drinking-buddy relationships, the Committee has a strong base to work from.

The pledge program should also be coordinated to work with the chapter academic program. Pledge projects are constructive ways to benefit the house as well as unify the class. They can range from outside projects that earn money for a charity or the shelter, to work projects that improve the aesthetic qualities of the house. There are many other constructive, positive ways to build a Delt brotherhood without the use of hazing.

Once the program is laid out and implemented, the Committee must continue to meet regularly in order to make the program succeed. Members need to keep tabs on any problems that arise, and iron them out as soon as

possible. They must also keep the chapter well informed of the progress of the program. As with any new program, there will be problems and frustrations.

The chapter must be patient and realize that nothing new can be perfect. Improvements can always be added to strengthen the program.

Building a new program that eliminates hazing, especially after years of old and tired traditions, is not easy. It is entirely possible, however, and it is imperative. With commitment, dedication, and some hard work, every chapter can build a better Delt brotherhood. A brotherhood that lives up to the ideals in our own Delt Creed. ▲

What is Hazing?

The following list has been adopted by the Arch Chapter and Undergraduate Council as defining hazing. It was established from results of questionnaires sent to all undergraduate chapters of the Fraternity.

1. Calisthenics, such as sit-ups, push-ups, or any other form of physically abusive exercises.
2. Total and/or partial nudity at any time.
3. The eating or ingestion of any unwanted substance, such as eggs, liver, raw onions, spoiled foods, etc.
4. Wearing or carrying of any obscene or physically burdensome article.
5. Paddle swats, also includes the trading of swats with actives.
6. Pushing, shoving, tackling, or any other physical contact directed to pledges only.
7. Throwing oil, syrup, flour, etc . . . or any harmful substance on a pledge.
8. Rat court, kangaroo court, or other individual interrogation.
9. Forcing pledges to drink alcoholic beverages by either threats or peer pressure.
10. Line-ups of the pledge class for intense demeaning intimidation.
11. Transportation and abandonment of pledges and members, (road trips, kidnaps, walks, rides, drops, etc.).
12. Putting pledges in an area which is uncomfortable or confining (hot box effect, high temperature, too small) during pledgeship or preinitiation week.
13. Any type of personal servitude performed for actives, such as errands, cleaning actives rooms etc., by the pledges which is demeaning and/or of personal benefit to the active members.
14. Feminine apparel of any kind worn in public places.
15. Assigning "pranks" such as stealing, painting objects, harassing other organizations.
16. Members intentionally messing up, pitting out, destroying the house or a room for the pledges to clean up.
17. Calling pledges demeaning names, (scums, maggots, etc.).
18. Yelling and screaming at pledges.
19. Actives requiring the pledges to have boxing matches, fights, etc., between the pledges for actives' enjoyment.



EIGHT DELTS survived training camps and made the opening NFL rosters this fall. The dean of the Delt players is now ten-year veteran quarterback JIM PLUNKETT, Stanford '71, whose first pass of the season went for an 18-yard touchdown for Oakland. Other returning veterans are Minnesota Vikings linebacker JEFF SIEMON, Stanford '72; Kansas City Chiefs offensive tackle MATT HERKENHOFF, Minnesota '74; Washington Redskins offensive guard GARY ANDERSON, Stanford '77; New York Giants offensive tackle GORDON KING, Stanford '78; and San Francisco 49'ers running back PHIL FRANCIS, Stanford '79. Two rookies from Stanford stuck with the Seattle Seahawks, offensive lineman ANDRE HINES and free agent linebacker TERRY RENNAKER. Three-year Seattle veteran DENNIS BOYD, Oregon State '77, broke his arm in the pre-season after being shifted from defensive end to offensive tackle. He opened the season on the Injured Reserve list as did rookie linebacker CHUCK EVANS, Stanford '80, of the New Orleans Saints, who sustained a shoulder separation near the end of camp.

One of the National Football League's main supportive groups, NFL Properties, Inc., has two Delts filling key positions. BOB CAREY, Wesleyan '54, has served as President of NFL Properties since 1970 and JOHN CARNEY, USC '61, has been Vice-President of the Retail Licensing Division, also since






