## *The Arch Chapter*

TWO NEW NAMES appear on the Fraternity's Arch Chapter, as the result of Karnea elections. However, both Dr. Hoyt D. Gardner and Dr. James L. Conley have long records of service to Delta Tau Delta, as well as to their professions.

Dr. Gardner, featured speaker at the Karnea Leadership Luncheon, was elected secretary of the Fraternity, succeeding Wayne A. Sinclair, who was elected second vice-president. A recent president of the American Medical Association, Dr. Gardner has been a well-known Louisville, Ky., surgeon for more than 20 years, serving also as an associate clinical professor of surgery at the University of Louisville. He has been honored by Westminster College, where he was graduated in 1946, by numerous professional groups, and as a recipient of the Fraternity's Alumni Achievement Award.

Dr. Conley, a 1959 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan, received his Ph.D. from Michigan State in 1968, also serving as a member of the faculty there. Currently a Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Co. agent specializing in estate planning at Macomb, Ill., he has 17 years' experience in public school and college teaching, including professor and director of research at Western Illinois University's College of Education from 1968 to 1978. Among his many services to the Fraternity have been chapter adviser at Western Illinois, Scholarship Advisory Committee member, frequent special representative (Phonarch) on chapter evaluations, and secretary of the past two Karneas. In addition to being elected director of academic affairs, he was named to the Distinguished Service Chapter at the St. Louis Karnea. He succeeds R. James Rockwell, Jr., who served in the academic affairs position for eight years, choosing not to run for re-election because of the press of business as a laser energy consultant.

In succeeding Kenneth N. Folgers as Fraternity President, the Rev. Grover C. "Tex" McElyea moves up from vice-president and ritualist. He is succeeded in that position by Donald G. Kress, who moves from second vice-president. David L. Nagel was re-elected treasurer.

The four division presidents, who also serve on the Arch Chapter, are elected at individual division conferences in off-Karnea years. Current presidents are Thomas S. Sharp, Southern; Jeff Heatherington, Western; Steven A. Paquette, Eastern; and William R. Hirsch, Northern.



# Reflections of the Karnea

INTERESTING, emotional, exciting, inspirational, thought-provoking and fun were descriptions of the Karnea, voiced by undergraduates and alumni as they departed from the Gateway City to rejoin families and chapters across our continent and around the world. These men represent the leadership of Delta Tau Delta, charged with enthusiasm and ideas that will forge the path of our great Fraternity over the next two years. There is a special enthusiasm that can be generated only by an exciting and successful Karnea.

To those undergraduates who have never attended a Karnea, delegates returning to chapters from St. Louis may appear changed, or at least revitalized. There is a reason for this excitement, for these men represent the most knowledgeable members on current Fraternity affairs. Hopefully, each will give a detailed report of his Karnea experience to his chapter.

There is much to be learned from these Karnea veterans. They were exposed to a most carefully planned schedule promoting the very essence of fraternity created by the Karnea theme, "Gateway To Brotherhood."

It was obvious from the opening moments of the 76th Karnea that this convention would be different in a new and exciting way. A partnership between alumni and undergraduates was forged early into what would become a sharing of ideas bridging generations of years and experience. From the first business session when President Ken Folgers mentioned Karnea emphasis would be placed on ritualistic practice and chapter singing, to the keynote address from the Honorable Reuben Askew at the Karnea Banquet, every moment was utilized to provide both undergraduates and alumni with practical information that would afford every chapter a better Delt experience for its members.

With baton in hand, Western Division President Jeff Heatherington started a new Karnea tradition of opening and closing each business session by teaching delegates a new or familiar Delt tune. President Folgers's goal of chapter singing was accomplished early, as undergraduates and alumni spent hours throughout the convention sharing songs with each other, while learning a most valuable lesson of the Karnea: no chapter program in existence (with so little effort by the membership) can promote such a sense of brotherhood within a chapter than a regular song rehearsal or sorority serenade. Very few opportunities come when each member has a chance to participate at the same time with all his brothers to accomplish a common goal. Whether a chapter has 15 members or 150, a good chapter song program will heighten morale and promote a sense of pride




that is impossible to describe, exciting to experience, and simple to do.

Through prior publicity, the 76th Karnea had been billed as one that would teach what brotherhood is and how it could promote better chapter programming. The Karnea Committee led by Judge Robert O. Snyder, Ohio '39, made certain that the convention lived up to all its promises. Opening day festivities were crowned by the "Gateway Reception," featuring a special taste of St. Louis, provided by a four-piece Dixieland band. This was the first chance delegates had to meet one another and become acquainted. It also provided the opportunity for undergraduates and alumni to meet and talk with members of the Arch Chapter and Central Office staff.

Later that evening many of those new friendships were cemented as Delts from across the U.S. and Canada discovered Laclede's Landing, a gaslighted area of restaurants and night spots on the riverfront, where they discussed common concerns at their local chapters, similar frustrations and possible solutions. This evening of discovery extended into the morning, and the last Delt had hardly gotten to bed before the Central Office staff was at work putting final touches on the day's events; for that day would bring some of the most meaningful discussions of the Karnea, facilitated by leading professionals in a workshop setting. Every leadership seminar had been meticulously placed in the Karnea program to support the convention theme, which had been so carefully chosen.

The day's events started with an innovation called, "Sunrise Sessions." Delegate early risers made these such a success that their continuance at future Karnenas was assured. Featuring topics



of special interest, these sessions afforded undergraduates and alumni discussions with knowledgeable people on various areas of chapter programming.

Each Karnea leadership workshop was woven into a fabric that would promote a higher level of brotherhood and henceforth better chapter operations. The first set of seminars was devoted to promoting the right chapter attitude, with William J. McGrane, III, Cincinnati '79, doing a presentation on motivation. Mr. McGrane related to the group that to motivate a chapter you must first create an environment that motivates people. The session continued for the rest of the morning, with discussions on what tends to motivate us and the people around us.

After four inspirational division luncheons, it was back to an afternoon session entitled, "Your Brothers' Brother." Dr. Tom Goodale, vice chancellor for student affairs at the University of Denver, gave an outstanding presentation on responsible alcohol use, and led a workshop that

enabled members to clarify their ideas of what alcohol abuse really is.

That evening the entire Karnea took a step back in time to enjoy one of the remaining pleasures of yesterday that still lives on the "Father of Waters." After boarding two paddle wheel steamers at Wharf Street below the Gateway Arch, both Karnea neophytes and Karnea hounds enjoyed an evening cruise on the Mississippi River where delegates and guests listened and danced to traditional Dixieland music. Toward the end of the cruise, Delts started making their own music, and the evening was climaxed with a serenade of the Fraternity's First Lady, Ginger Folgers.

As the enchantment of Thursday faded, Friday's inspiration took its place. With a strike of the gavel that called the morning's session to order, the Karnea continued on its discovery of brotherhood as it is manifested in the Ritual.

That morning's leadership workshops were devoted to the

promotion of brotherhood and how it is attained. Director of Chapter Services Keith Steiner, and former Chapter Consultant Ken Glass presented the reasons that chapters should prepare better-defined membership education programs that promote involvement in both chapter and Fraternity.

"How to Apply Our Ritual," led by Vice President G. C. "Tex" McElyea, and former Chapter Consultant Mike Perros, climaxed the sessions on Ritual; for the first time discussing the purpose of our Ritual in practical, everyday terms. This session examined the Delt Creed, Oath, Pledge Ceremony, Rite of Iris and Charge, breaking them into their significant parts and posing very specific questions on how we might use these symbolic words and ceremonies in the day-to-day operations of a chapter. Results were astounding, as undergraduates and alumni rose to the occasion by naming projects and activities that could reflect the very essence of this intangible thing called brotherhood.

The session proved to be a prelude to what would take place that afternoon following the intriguing words of Dr. Hoyt Gardner, Westminster '46 at the Friday Leadership Luncheon. At 2 p.m. that afternoon, the Karnea reconvened for an exciting presentation on the Ritual that helped the Karnea theme come to life.

Edward M. King, dean of students at Bradley University, stood before the Karnea and delivered an hour and fifteen-minute presentation that left alumni and undergraduates spellbound, and well prepared for the model Ritual to follow. Dean King showed delegates the meaning of ritual and how they could use their specific Ritual to improve the quality of their fra-



ternity experience.

Members then proceeded to view Delta Tau Delta's Ritual ceremonies with great intensity as they were performed flawlessly by members of Westminster College, University of Missouri at Rolla, and the University of Missouri at Columbia.

Saturday brought the final business sessions, with election of international officers heading the agenda. The Rev. G. C. "Tex" McElyea, Ohio Wesleyan '47 and Pennsylvania '47, was elected President of the Fraternity. Elected to serve with him during the next two years, were Donald G.

Kress, Lafayette '58, vice-president and ritualist; Wayne A. Sinclair, West Virginia '68, second vice-president; David L. Nagel, Iowa State '63, treasurer; Dr. Hoyt D. Gardner, Westminster '45, secretary; and Dr. James L. Conley, Ohio Wesleyan '59, director of academic affairs.

A full slate of other business brought voting on Constitutional amendments, selection of Lexington, Ky., as site of the 1986 Karnea (the 1984 Karnea will be held in Columbus, Ohio), and a variety of awards to both undergraduates and alumni.

Traditionally, the Karnea Banquet brought activities to a close, with Deltas and guests filling the ballroom of the Stouffer's Riverfront Towers Hotel. Former Florida Governor Reubin O.O. Askew, Florida State '51, often mentioned as a U.S. Presidential candidate possibility for 1984, addressed the banquet audience on the importance of individual commitment to excellence and the values of preparing for leadership.

Karnea Chairman Snyder, who is a judge of the Missouri Court of Appeals, served as toastmaster. Retiring Fraternity President Kenneth N. Folgers presented Alumni Achievement Awards to eight Deltas, before turning over the presidential gavel to Father McElyea. New members of the Distinguished Service Chapter were introduced by DSC Committee members Francis M. Hughes (chairman), G. Herbert McCracken, and John W. Nichols.

For undergraduates and alumni, the final day was one of work, reflection, and celebration. The Karnea creates a feeling difficult to describe for a person who has not attended one of the biennial affairs. As the St. Louis Karnea ended, booths torn down and banners folded away in anticipation of Columbus in 1984, one could only wonder about the Karnea spirit that will emerge in two short years.

St. Louis brought a reawakening of many ideas concerning ritual and the deepest meanings of our Fraternity. For Columbus, the question of a theme will be answered by Delta Tau Delta's progress along the lines that brought exceptional response to the theme of the 76th Karnea, "Gateway to Brotherhood."

## Sunrise Sessions




Charles Edwards, left, receives Fraering Award from President Folgers.

### Tribute to Folgers

In brief comments to members of the Distinguished Service Chapter at a Karnea luncheon, newly elected President McElvea paid tribute to his predecessor, saying, "Ken Folgers will be remembered as one of the truly outstanding Presidents in the history of our Fraternity." He pointed to the fact that "Delta Tau Delta is in excellent condition in every way," and that "undergraduates make a point of mentioning the inspiration they receive personally from Ken and collectively from his dedication to chapter improvement." President McElvea's observation was reinforced by statements made throughout the Karnea by undergraduates and alumni who have worked with Mr. Folgers during his many years of Arch Chapter service that began with presidency of the Northern Division in 1971.

### First Karnea

**M**AJOR GEN. (Ret.) Robert M. Ives waited 61 years after his 1921 graduation from Columbia to attend his first Karnea, although like Carl Mahnke, he has been a participant in Delt activities. He is a long-time leader and past president of the Houston Alumni Chapter, which he represented as official delegate. "Seeing a Karnea in action, and meeting so many good Dels has been a most enjoyable experience," he said.

**A**T THE Karnea Banquet, DePauw University President **Richard Rosser**, an Alumni Achievement Award recipient, was greeted by **Richard Rosser**, an undergraduate at Washington & Lee University. ## Record Claimed

## HAROLD W. BANGERT North Dakota '27

After receiving a law degree from George Washington University, Harold Bangert served as an attorney for the Federal Trade Commission for two years before launching what was to become a 46-year private law practice in North Dakota. During that time, he served the country in several positions, including national director of price control boards in Washington. Meanwhile, he organized television stations in Sioux Falls, St. Paul, and Alexandria, Minn., insurance companies in Fargo and Des Moines, and an investment firm in San Francisco. The latter became the leader in corporate financing using stock ownership plans. Mr. Bangert is a former professional trombone player and his hunting skill was such that he wrote the North Dakota Bird Hunting Guide in 1946. Currently he is writing a book on economics, gathering research at Stanford, Berkeley, and Oxford, England.

## MELVIN BELLI California '29

One of the world's best known attorneys, Melvin Belli has been called the "king of torts" for his work in personal injury cases. Based in San Francisco, he has been making legal history for four decades. His current case load focuses on 75 victims of the Las Vegas MGM Grand Hotel fire, the Hyatt skywalk collapse in Kansas City, and the 1981 Taiwan air crash. He defended Jack Ruby, and won dismissal of a case against Jani Adams in the sensational "Death Angel" trial two years ago. He has been described as flamboyant, witty, and irascible in court, but 300 attorneys from around the country honored him last year by forming the Belli Society to promote the practice of common law through major universities. He has written 40 books, tried innumerable legal cases, and lived what has been called an outrageously colorful life around the world. A motion picture currently is being made about that life.

## BERNARD J. DEGEN II George Washington '59

Last year, Bernard Degen received the Distinguished Service Medal after serving for six months as a special assistant and chief of staff to the U.S. Secretary of Energy. It was the highest recognition a Cabinet officer may grant. Mr. Degen served in the Department while on leave from his regular duties as executive director of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, a national surgical dental organization based in Chicago. He has held that chief executive and administrative office position since 1966, having earlier completed graduate work in cellular physiology and biochemistry at Temple, served as an Army officer, and as a medical and surgical editor for a textbook publisher. In 1976 he became the third layman in the 59-year history of the AAOMS to receive an honorary fellowship, an honor he also has received from the International College of Dentists.

## P. D. "BUD" HERMANN Lawrence '45

After attending Lawrence College, then graduating from Northwestern in 1948, "Bud" Hermann joined the Associated Equipment Distributors organization in Oak Park, just outside Chicago, as editor of its magazine. Two years later, at age 25, he became one of the youngest persons to head a major national trade association, when he was named chief staff executive. Today, his title is executive vice-president of AED, and the association itself has developed into a strong, influential group of 1,600 members, with a legislative staff in Washington supplementing its office staff in Oak Park. Mr. Hermann also is president of AED's affiliated service corporation, and for the past two years he has served on the Board of Directors of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. In 1981 he was selected "Association Executive of the Year" in a nationwide poll conducted by Association Trends Newsmagazine.

**JOSEPH C. LADD**  
Ohio Wesleyan '50

WHEN HE WENT from high school into the U.S. Navy, Joseph Ladd was assigned to submarine duty. After returning from the Philippines and receiving a degree from Ohio Wesleyan, he launched a career in the insurance business. Whether there was a subconscious association between the two is open to speculation. But Joe Ladd obviously received the right motivation somewhere. Since 1971 he has been president and chief executive officer of the Fidelity Mutual Life Insurance Co., with headquarters in Philadelphia. Mr. Ladd joined Fidelity Mutual as vice-president of sales in 1964. He had started his career as an agent for Connecticut General, moving through management ranks to become head of the Los Angeles branch. He also is on the Board of Electors of the Insurance Hall of Fame and a member of three insurance associations. In 1979 he was named "Man of the Year" by the YMCA.

**DUANE M. LEACH**  
South Dakota '57

AFTER HOLDING positions of leadership in all administrative levels of higher education, Dr. Duane Leach was named to his present position as chancellor for the University System of South Texas. During his earlier career he was professor and department chairman at Southwest Minnesota State College, dean of the College of Idaho, president of Northern Montana College, and president of Texas A & I University. Among his added duties is membership on Texas A & M's "Target 2000" project committee, making plans for the next two decades. He also serves on several councils and committees, including the Governor's Task Force on Higher Education and chairman of the Council of Presidents of the Public Senior Colleges and Universities of Texas. Dr. Leach received his M.A. degree from the University of South Dakota, and the Ph.D. in 1964 from the University of Oklahoma.

**C. C. ODOM, II**  
Texas Christian '66

IT HAS BEEN said that C. C. Odom can not only survive, but even thrive in the eye of several hurricanes simultaneously. He is an independent member and trader of the Chicago Board of Trade, the Chicago Board Options Exchange, and the New Orleans Commodity Exchange. Mr. Odom received his undergraduate degree and studied at the graduate level in economics and finance at TCU, then took further studies at the New York Institute of Finance. From 1968 to 1972 he was vice-president and a partner in the Walston Company, a member firm of all major security and commodity exchanges. Now, as an independent trader, he also holds positions of responsibility in several associated organizations. He is current vice-chairman of the Chicago Board of Trade, and a director of the International Precious Metals Institute. He is a director of the Better Boys Foundation and of the Chicago Landmarks Preservation Council.

**RICHARD F. ROSSER**  
Ohio Wesleyan '51

IN FORCE duty during the Korean War, following his graduation from Ohio Wesleyan, had a strong influence on the career of Dr. Richard Rosser. As a second lieutenant, he earned the Master of Public Administration Degree, then was assigned to the Russian Language School at Syracuse University. Later, he completed his Ph.D. in political science at Syracuse, and was assigned to the Air Force Academy faculty, where he was promoted to colonel. Before retiring from the Air Force in 1973 to become dean of the faculty at Albion College, Dr. Rosser initiated a strong liberal arts program into the Academy curricula. In 1977, he left Albion to take up his present duties as president of DePauw University. Today he is known as one of the nation's leading liberal arts spokesmen, warning that there is great danger in specializing too narrowly when the problems in our complex world are related to so many different disciplines.

# INFLUENCING LIVES

*"Tex" McElyea has followed a career of showing others, including his brother Delts*

ALTHOUGH he was born in Leflore, Okla., Delta Tau Delta's new president has been a Texan since the age of six months, when his family moved to Dallas. Much of his college life, and consequently his introduction to the Fraternity, was determined by the Navy during World War II.

After graduating from high school, slender young Grover C. McElyea joined the Naval Air Corps (eating six bananas and drinking a quart of milk in a successful last-minute attempt to reach the minimum weight for his height), then enrolled at North Texas State University for one semester while waiting to be called to active duty.

Active service began at the University of Texas and Schreiner Institute, followed by pre-flight schooling at the University of Georgia and secondary training at Memphis Naval Air Station. With none of his family having ever attended college, Mr. McElyea at that point in his life had plans of making a career of Naval flying. That hope was scuttled, however, just before completion of his flight training, when he was transferred to Great Lakes Naval Training Center for re-assignment. It was there he received one of the nicknames that has stayed with him through the years. At Great Lakes, he became known as "Tex."

After taking a battery of examinations, "Tex" was selected for the two-year V-12 college training program and sent to Ohio Wesleyan University, where he became a Delt. Although the Navy prescribed courses, his previous college credit put him in a

special category, permitting him to select a regular college program. Completing two years' study in 15 months, he planned to receive his commission and get married, then begin a tour of sea duty.

Again, however, the Navy had other plans. With a backlog of officers, they transferred "Tex" to a four-year V-7 program, and enrolled him at the University of Pennsylvania. Again classified as an "irregular" student, he was permitted to choose courses. With that flexibility, he decided to pursue economics and prepare for a career in the insurance business.

When the war ended in 1945, "Tex" had completed one year at Penn. This time he did get married to Mary Lou Stanard, who had been a classmate at North Dallas High School and a student at Texas State College for Women.

Although considering the possibility of remaining in the Navy, he decided to take the discharge for which he was eligible under the "point system." Then he faced a dilemma about returning to Ohio Wesleyan for his degree or remaining at the University of Pennsylvania, which was exceptionally strong in economics. For advice in making that decision, "Tex" went to University Chaplain Father Clemens Kolb, who asked if he had considered the ministry and suggested that something in his nature pointed toward that possibility.

"My first reaction was that I never had thought about such a career," he recalled, "but I gradually realized I quite possibly had influences in my early life that

created such feelings, although I never had expressed them openly."

Both he and Mary Lou were invited to discuss the ministry with Father Kolb. That evening's conversation had a profound influence on the decision to return to Ohio Wesleyan and complete a liberal arts education.

Following graduation in 1947, "Tex" attended Seabury Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill., receiving the LTh degree in 1950. Then he accepted his first assignment as Father McElyea by serving five Episcopal churches in Northeast Texas, commuting to all of them from the city of Sulfur Springs.

A little more than two years later, Mary Lou contracted polio and spent nine months in a Dallas hospital. With continued service in the distant Sulfur Springs area no longer feasible, Father McElyea was called to St. Michael's and All Angels' Church in Dallas, where he served as associate rector for 10 years. In 1962 he went to Waco, as rector of St. Alban's Church, and in 1966 he began long service as rector of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Dallas.

The McElyeas have four children, Mark, Beth, Meg, and Andrew. In 1980, Father McElyea left full-time ministry to join Beth's husband, Don Darley, in a Dallas tile distributing company. He continued as a working priest, however, through regular assignments from the Bishop's office.

During his career, Father McElyea has served Delta Tau Delta in many ways, including four years as a Western Division vice-

president, four years as Western Division president, and three terms as vice-president and ritualist of the Fraternity. He became president temporarily when William J. Fraering was killed in 1979, serving until Ken Folgers was appointed to the position a month later. He then continued as vice-president and ritualist during the elected term of Folgers, and was elected unanimously to the Fraternity's top office at the St. Louis Karnea.

"Tex," as he continues to be known by close Fraternity friends, or "Father Mac," as he is best known to parishioners, has provided a strong moral influence on the lives of friends and colleagues, particularly young people. Recently, he has felt a strong call to full-time status in the ministry. As a result, he has accepted a position, working directly with the Bishop as priest in charge (vicar) of Our Merciful Savior Episcopal Church, a mission church in Kaufman, Texas, near Dallas. He and Mary Lou will continue to live in their present Dallas home. ▲






## COLLEGE FOOTBALL

**S**TANFORD University's Heisman Trophy candidate, quarterback JOHN ELWAY, was one of six outstanding collegiate stars who participated in the annual NCAA-ABC-TV football promotion tour in August. After a successful summer with the New York Yankee's Oneonta farm club, he said "I'm pleased, especially considering I hadn't played baseball in a year and everyone else had played college ball or been to spring training."

This fall, John completes his football eligibility and, next summer, following the NFL draft, becomes the property of two professional teams in different sports. The tough decision of which sport to play will come then. John says "I'm trying not to think about it at all. There are simply too many variables that I don't know about yet, such as what team I get drafted by, how much money I could make and what my chances of playing right away would be. I don't know which one of these variables will end up weighing more in my mind. It's too early to tell."

If Elway chooses baseball, he says he will keep the football door open just in case. On the other hand, he says, if he chooses football, the decision will be final. Much, of course, depends on how this football season goes and if the opening game is any indication, it will be a banner year. Against Purdue in the 1982 opener, John passed for 4 touchdowns to set a new Pacific-10 career record.

(Just before The Rainbow went to press, Elway broke one single game school record with 63 attempts and tied another with 35 completions, as he guided Stanford to a dramatic win over Ohio State, before a nationwide television audience. He passed for 407 yards and two touchdowns, with 22 completions in 36 attempts for 284 yards during Stanford's second-half comeback. He hit four of six passed to cover 80 yards in 64 seconds for a touchdown with just 34 seconds left in the game, bringing the final score to 23-20.)

Twelve-year veteran JIM PLUNKETT, Stanford '71, quarterbacked his Los Angeles Raiders team to an opening day win over the defending Super Bowl champion 49'ers. Linebacker JEFF SIEMON, Stanford '72, after being traded to San Diego, decided to retire and was put on waivers by the Chargers. He had a change of heart and was picked up by his original club, the Minnesota Vikings, in time for the opening game.

Three Delt offensive tackles began the season as regulars for their clubs: MATT HERKENHOFF, Minnesota '74, of the Kansas City Chiefs; DENNIS BOYD, Oregon State '77, of the Seattle Seahawks; and GORDON KING, Stanford '78, of the New York Giants. JOHN OLENCHALK, Stanford '77, is a backup linebacker and center for the Kansas City Chiefs while Atlanta's number two draft choice, DOUG ROGERS from Stanford, is a reserve defensive end.

Serving as NFL assistant coaches once again are RAY PROCHASKA, Nebraska '41, of the Buffalo Bills; BOYD DOWLER, Colorado '59, of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers; and HOWARD MUDD, Michigan State-Hillsdale '64, with the Seattle Seahawks. Working behind the scenes are Denver Broncos Coordinator of College Scouting CARROLL HARDY, Colorado '55; New England Patriots Trainer TOM HEALION, Miami '52; and KEN FLOWER, USC '53, director of marketing and community affairs for the San Francisco 49'ers.

## BASEBALL

For the first time in a number of years, there was a good-sized contingent of Delts playing pro baseball in 1982. Infielder STEVE BUECHELE of Stanford was drafted fifth by the Texas Rangers and went to their Tulsa Texas League farm club. He hit .296 with 5 homers and 33 RBI's in 62 games as the Drillers won the Texas League championship. Following the playoffs, Steve went to the Florida Instructional League.

Lefthanded reliever GARY REITER, Bowling Green State '80, had the best season of his four-year pro career. The Atlanta Braves farmhand finished second in the Carolina League in both games pitched and saves as his Durham club won the loop's Southern Division crown. Gary posted a 9-7 record with 16 saves in 61 appearances. He had a fine 2.81 earned run average and struck out 77 batters in 67.1 innings pitched.

Two former Stanford teammates opposed each other in the New York-Pennsylvania League this past summer.

Outfielder JOHN ELWAY played for the Oneonta Yankees and batted .318 with 4 homers and 25 RBI's in 42 games. White Sox draftee MIKE TOOTHMAN saw action as an outfielder and designated hitter for league champion Niagara Falls. In 61 contests, he hit .233 with 8 home runs and 30 runs batted in.

He's looking forward to the 1984 Olympic Games which will be held in Los Angeles.


## BASKETBALL

IT WAS Mother's Day, 1982, and all over America people were home enjoying a peaceful Sunday afternoon with Mom. Yet, in Boston and the surrounding areas of Massachusetts the bars were full of excited men and women. Outside the Boston Garden, thousands of fans were chanting, "We're number one, we're number one."

Inside the Garden, game one of the Boston-Philadelphia National Basketball Association semi-final playoffs was about to begin. All over New England, loyal Celtics fans were glued to television sets, and one of the most exciting basketball rivalries was underway.

For the first quarter, the lead changed hands every few minutes, and it looked as if a typical Celtic-76'ers game was unfolding. Midway through the second quarter, Boston coach Bill Fitch replaced center Robert Parrish with Rick Robey. Standing at 6'11" and weighing in at 250 pounds, Mr. Robey was about to unleash a performance that would put the Sixers so far under they could not come back in this first game.

Rick Robey scored 15 points so quickly and took down rebounds with such intensity, it helped the rest of the Celtics loosen up and go on to win the game by 40 points.

Rick Robey, Kentucky '78 (College of Agriculture), has risen to the top of competition at every level. In high school at New Orleans, he was a member of a state championship basketball team. Then he became a collegiate national champion when Kentucky won the NCAA tournament. In 1978 he became a Boston Celtic, and in 1981 the Celtics easily beat the Houston Rockets in the NBA finals.

During an interview, Mr. Robey said he became a member of Delta Tau Delta in 1974, because


at least 10 more years in the NBA. There are many teams on which he would be a starter.

Mr. Robey says it is great to be a Celt, but playing basketball is his main concern. He pointed out the frustration he felt not playing enough as the Celtics went down to defeat to the 76'ers in game seven last spring. He feels he can play ball with most teams and play to win. He says as long as he is healthy and enjoying the game he will continue to play.

When asked his opinions of other players of past and present years, he spoke of growing up watching Dave Cowens, and then the thrill of suddenly becoming his teammate in 1978. Then, faced with the question of who was the greatest Celtic, he said Larry Bird will be the greatest Celt ever to play for Boston. As for who was the toughest man to play against, it undoubtedly was Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, in Rick's opinion.

When Mr. Robey finished playing pro ball, he plans to stay in Kentucky and open stables for his thoroughbred horses. A breeder, he currently owns 11 horses.

As a Bostonian, I hope Mr. Robey stays with the Celtics. But wherever he goes, it is apparent he will, as always, do a great job. Deltas can be proud of his determination and dedication, and the fact he is a brother.



