

## A Tolerant Man

THE JULY RESIGNATION of U.S. Supreme Court Justice William J. Brennan, Jr. at the age of 84 ends the formal career of one of the Fraternity's most distinguished alumni. Presenting a compendium of that career in *The Rainbow* would appear redundant to anyone who reads newspapers and news magazines. It seems more appropriate to focus on some of the elements of his life and career that have been important to Delta Tau Delta.

Young Bill Brennan was an outstanding undergraduate member of Omega Chapter at the University of Pennsylvania. After graduating in 1928, he moved on to Harvard Law School, then to the career that led to the New Jersey State Supreme Court and in 1956 to the Supreme Court of the United States. President Dwight D. Eisenhower made the latter appointment even though they represented opposing political parties.

Justice Brennan never was actively engaged in Delt affairs, as was his good friend and colleague Justice Tom Clark, who served as international president of the Fraternity. Nevertheless, he supported the Fraternity and attended functions, where his amicable informal chats were highlights for undergraduates and alumni alike.

The lifelong dedication to liberalism for which Justice Brennan became best known, understandably came from being one of eight children whose father shoveled coal at a Newark, N.J. brewery after emigrating from Ireland, then became a union organizer and city commissioner.

Individual attitudes toward Justice Brennan's opinions vary with political preferences, of course. He was one of the most controversial members ever to occupy a seat on the high court, never hesitating to support such issues as the right to burn the flag (something he considers a waste of time with no benefit to demonstrator's objectives) or get an abortion (which he does not consider in conflict with being a good Catholic). Yet, few persons have questioned his dedication to preservation of equality under the Bill of Rights.

Justice Brennan is known as a tolerant man with a friendly smile, who greets and treats diplomats and doormen alike. He is credited with having been the most important influence in

# For the Education of Youth

**D**ELETA TAU DELTA has launched the most ambitious campaign in its history, designed to provide endowments for ongoing programs in three major areas: (1) leadership skills and development, (2) undergraduate education and guidance, and (3) scholarship and academic achievement.

The Goal: \$6,000,000.

Of that total goal, \$4 million will be raised in capital gifts and pledges, \$1 million through deferred giving, and \$1 million in annual giving.

Official lift-off was announced on Saturday morning, August 18, when Edwin L. Heminger, *Ohio Wesleyan* '48, a former president of the Fraternity and current chairman of its Educational Foundation, served as master of ceremonies for a program that combined audio-video presentations with a series of speakers playing roles in the campaign. In order of their appearance, participants were undergraduates Mark McDonald of Nebraska and Mike Mockler of Kent State; Educational Foundation Board members John W. Nichols, *Oklahoma* '36, Fred C. Tucker, Jr., *DePauw* '40, John W. Fisher, *Tennessee* '38, and Norval B. Stephens, Jr., *DePauw* '51, and Foundation President Gale Wilkerson, *Oklahoma State* '66.

Richard H. Englehart, *Indiana* '47, the campaign chairman, who attended the Karnea, but had to miss the Saturday morning meeting addressed the group via videotape, explaining that the campaign has two sources of funds, "long-term pledges from our brothers who can give us two, five, ten thousand dollars a year over three to five years, and deferred gifts of life insurance and bequests."

At the conclusion of the formal program, Mr. Tucker returned to the podium to orchestrate an enthusiastic procession of chapter representatives and individual alumni who came forward with pledges totaling nearly \$40,000.


Groundwork for The Campaign For Delta Tau Delta already has been established by 133 Delt alumni who have contributed a financial base of \$2,475,000 in cash commitments, plus deferred gifts with a cash value of \$516,646. Other members and friends of the Fraternity now are being asked to contribute or pledge the remainder.

The Target Date: July 31, 1991.

A special campaign brochure summarizes overall objective as the chance to "positively impact the lives of young men, to assist in the development of our future leaders, and to maintain the traditional strength of our Fraternity, presenting a unique personal opportunity for you to reaffirm the ideals of Delta Tau Delta by pledging your support."

Fifty-seven alumni representing all regions of the U.S. and part of Canada, are serving on a campaign Steering Committee. Regional vice chairmen are Mr. Stephens, former President Donald C. Kress, *Lafayette* '58, and R. Stevens Gilley, *Oregon State* '56.

Foundation President Wilkerson pointed out that the campaign "to invest major financial re-

sources in the future of the Fraternity," is not related to the annual giving program that has just begun its 18th year. (Results of the 1989-90 effort are reported in this issue.)

"One million of the \$6 million goal represents the three-year total of annual giving during the course of the capital gifts campaign," Mr. Wilkerson said. "It is important to emphasize, however, that the two campaigns are separate. We hope contributions to the endowment campaign will not detract from the ongoing support through annual giving. This part of the money will continue to be used for regular programs, as before."


Brochures answering questions concerning the campaign and describing methods of giving are being distributed to alumni, Mr. Wilkerson said. Contributions to the Educational Foundation are tax deductible.

**T**HE CAMPAIGN for Delta Tau Delta was a brainchild of the late Al Sheriff, *Washington & Jefferson '49*, president of the Educational Foundation when he proposed the idea to that organization's Board of Directors in 1985. Following the untimely death of Mr. Sheriff in February 1986, the Board, then chaired by Fred C. Tucker, Jr., *DePauw '40*, commissioned Sumner G. Rahr & Company, a Chicago development counselling group, to determine through a feasibility study if sufficient interest existed for establishment of such an endowment fund.

Receiving a positive report from that study, the board planned what is the first major capital gifts campaign in the Fraternity's history as a keystone for assuring success of programs most important to undergraduate achievement.

The campaign's first phase of obtaining major advance commitments was put into motion under the leadership of Chairman Englehart and George P. Loomis, *MIT '49*, who "signed on" in October 1986 for a three-year assignment as Foundation president after retiring as a vice president of Mogul Corporation, a division of The Dexter Corporation. Gale Wilkerson, *Oklahoma State '66*, succeeded Mr. Loomis as Foundation president in the summer of 1989, after seven years as executive vice president of the Fraternity.

Early members of an original Campaign Advisory Board also were instrumental in developing the financial pledges needed to complete phase one and make way for the Fraternity-wide campaign announced at the Karnea.

### FUNDING PRIORITIES

Specific funding priorities address the primary concerns of alumni, undergraduates, and members actively involved in leadership roles, from the Arch Chapter, through various administrative channels. Specific efforts to raise the money are tied to a broader objective of increasing volunteer opportunities among alumni.

Heading the list of programs are those that have proven successful in pilot projects or long experience, and others that have been thoroughly planned by Delt leaders and alumni with special expertise.

### LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Centerpiece of the proposed endeavors is a Leadership Academy based on modern principles and endorsed by university administrators. "So many concerns that undergraduates and alumni have about the future of the Fraternity revolve around leadership, that this has to be the core of development efforts," Mr. Wilkerson said. "Delta Tau Delta is one fraternity committed to having a strong impact in this arena."

Detailed plans for such an academy have been made by a committee chaired by Dr. James L. Conley, *Ohio Wesleyan '59*, former Northern Division president, and with professional input of A. J. "Bud" Murphy, *Penn State '36*, who developed training programs for Westinghouse during a long career in industry.

A former dean of men at Carnegie-Mellon, Mr. Murphy began his work at Westinghouse helping young graduates—between 400 and 800 of them a year—make the transition from college to industry. He later became manager of training and development, then director of executive development, heading programs involving some 30,000 persons over several years.

The proposed one-week intensive-study course, for which academic credit is expected to be received, will teach the competencies, rather than simply the traits of leadership. Participants will learn techniques with double-edged benefits de-

signed to assist them in their roles as chapter leaders, as well as help prepare them for careers.

Says Mr. Murphy: "We will be able to get an undergraduate leader to plan and achieve a specific mission for his chapter, and at the same time, develop a personal leadership pattern that will benefit him throughout his life."

## ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

New endowment funds designated for scholarships and academic achievement awards will provide deserving undergraduate and graduate Deltas with grants to help offset ever-increasing costs of education. The goal is to establish internationally recognized scholarships to support the Fraternity's educational mission, and achievement awards that encourage academic excellence.

## PREVENTING ALCOHOL ABUSE

Delts Talking About Alcohol, with pilot seminars already praised by universities and other Greek organizations, will progress into the main stream of the Delt experience. Income from the endowment will train undergraduate instructors for all divisions of the Fraternity and keep the program current. The endowment will support the program exclusively within the Fraternity, with outside funding sought as other organizations request participation.

Developed by the Prevention Research Institute of Lexington, Ky., the instructional program is headed by Ray Daugherty and Terry O'Bryan who prepared an earlier prototype for the U.S. Army. It presents specific methods of lifestyle risk reduction, rather than generalities, and it has drawn an overwhelmingly positive response from participants during its pilot phase. Gilbert D. Standley, DePauw '82, director of alumni development, has been coordinating the pilot programs.

## CHAPTER CONSULTANTS

The Fraternity's consultant program offering a practical "delivery system" to undergraduate chapters is the envy of the fraternity world. Delta Tau Delta competes with corporations and graduate schools to attract top men from graduating classes

to spend one or two years as front-line educators of the Fraternity. Their commitment and training prepares them to greatly enhance undergraduate leadership, avoid potential chapter problems, and assist alumni involved in house corporations and other local activities. Moreover, virtually all chapter consultants progress from their positions to rewarding careers, often including graduate schools, and they remain active as Delt alumni leaders.

Success of The Campaign for Delta Tau Delta will assure continued support of training, travel and compensation to attract top candidates, and provide for the addition of a sixth consultant.

## OTHER PROGRAMS

To make information available on individual chapters, as well as the international Fraternity, a small part of the endowment is slated to be used in maintaining Fraternity archives, preserving historical and membership records, other important documents, and photographs. Assistance now being given to chapters seeking to prepare local histories can be increased, as well.

Computers, entrenched as among the most important educational, management, and research tools, offer the potential for growing educational resources enrichment of chapters. The Educational Foundation would like to insure that each chapter have these and other basic tools such as library reference materials, as more attention is given to living environments being conducive to study and academic achievement.

Plans to increase educational and leadership publications are being made in anticipation of the campaign meeting its goal. The position of director of alumni development, initiated two years ago, also is to be partially supported by the increased endowment. The director of alumni development provides effective leadership and guidance necessary for success at the local chapter level.

In addition to funding these top priority projects, an enlarged Educational Foundation endowment eventually will allow expansion of loans for construction and renovation of Delt Shelters, a critical need in all four divisions of the Fraternity.

# Academics A Cure for

In my second annual report to *The Rainbow*, I am sad to report that the downward slide in Delt academics continues. The solution does not lie with traditional fraternity programming which requires individual behavior modification, is short-term, and necessarily reiterative. The longer-term solution to Delt academic woes lies with rush; more specifically, stressing academics in our membership recruitment programs.

But before we discuss the prescription, let's take a look at the diagnosis. This article is a companion to the 1989 Academic Annual Report sent to all chapter and Fraternity officers last spring. Each year chapters are ranked academically within their Divisions into four groups: Flagships (excellent), Ships-of-the-line (good), Frigate (average to mediocre), and those In Dry Dock (lousy or not reporting).

The overall ranking model places a 50 percent emphasis on chapter grade-point-average as compared to the campus all-men's-average. The remaining 50 percent measures pledge attrition, initiation standards, academic programming, and scholastic honours.

Table I summarizes the academic performance of our chapters over the last three years. The high variability in grade-point-averages across divisions and over time obscures what is really happening.



Therefore, what we call "Index B" is calculated for each chapter, each division, and Delta Tau Delta as a whole. Index B measures the performance of each chapter against its local campus all-men's-average; higher the score, better a chapter's performance.

Figure 1 therefore gives a clearer picture of what is happening. The Eastern Division climbed out of the basement into second place, even though its score this year is almost identical to that of last year. The Northern Division slipped a bit, but held onto third place. After several good years, the Southern Division plummeted from first to last. And finally, the Western Division made it

to the top after several years of solid gains, even though its score is lower than last year's—and that says it all.

Delta Tau Delta is losing ground. We are falling behind the academic leadership of our host institutions. This is evident in the fact that the average Delt Index B dropped from 85.4 in 1987 to 83.5 in 1988 and then to 80.9 in 1989.

As a result, 50 percent of our chapters have been placed on Academic Alert (spring 1990 *Rainbow*). No longer do a majority of our chapters operate at or above the all-men's-average on our respective campuses. The 1989 school year also saw 25 Delt chapters (up from six in 1988) lose 20 percent or more of their pledges due to academic delinquency.

After years of working with undergraduate

chapters, this tells us one thing: they are rushing, pledging, and initiating the wrong kind of man.

Delta Tau Delta does not want to become an elitist organization, but we do need to clean up our act as far as recruitment is concerned. We have a program called "Index Rushees" (see Figure 2). It is relatively complicated, asking the chapter to place rushees into a grade-point quartile. The aim is to have a pledge class average of between 2.50 and 2.80 on a 4-point scale.

Only a handful of chapters have tackled indexing for rush. But for those who did, the evidence is clear: if you rush scholars, you will soon have a chapter of scholars.

We do not expect 125 chapters with 4.0 averages. What Delta Tau Delta needs is simply to return to its founding principle—that of being a

social fraternity pledged to achieving and justly recognizing academic excellence.

Chapters take risks at rush. They bid and pledge men who are superior athletes, men who will "fit in," and men who are superior "socially" in the narrowest and most negative sense of that word. Fraternities generally, Delta Tau Delta included, reinforce this behaviour by helping their chapters improve their poor study habits.

For Delta Tau Delta today, reactive behaviour modification is out and proactive membership recruitment is in. If we are truly a social fraternity in the higher sense of the word, then let's take another kind of risk.

Rather than pledge non-scholars and then try to help them get through college, let's pledge more scholars each year and help them round out their social and life skills. To our undergraduate readers, I challenge you to try it. If you need help, ask your chapter consultant on his next visit. It is not easy and it takes work. In the meantime, we will endeavour to reformat the indexing program to make it more straightforward.

To our alumni readers, I ask you to work with your chapter, your chapter's adviser or house corporation, or the chapter nearest you and help them refocus their rush efforts away from taking academic risks—hoping that their star athletes, socializers, and "great guys" will make their grades—to taking some social risks. Help them rush, bid, and pledge men with above-average academic potential.

This is the greatest challenge Delta Tau Delta has ever handed its members. Your goal is a pledge class of men with diverse talents and backgrounds, most having a high probability of finishing college, and a significant number capable of honours in their chosen fields. Once this has been achieved in a majority of our chapters, the numbers reported at the beginning of this article will shift dramatically upward.

We stand by to help you any way we can, but this battle has to be won on the field—by you.

# THE TIME HAD COME

**A**T FIRST THERE WAS ONLY SILENCE. Most of the men stared straight ahead. One looked at another. Jim Wattenbarger had just announced to the officers of Delta Zeta Chapter (University of Florida) that, effective immediately, chapter funds could no longer be used to buy alcohol. With the university's reputation as the "professional party school of the South," this could be the death knell of Delta Tau Delta on campus.

Jim is president of the House Corporation. Alcohol related problems were a constant thorn in the side of Jim and his committee. The decision had not been easy. It had been discussed for over three years. Two years before, the president of the chapter had been told to start getting ready to find alternatives to alcohol-centered party events. One year before, the officers had been asked to get the chapter to eliminate alcohol from the budget. Neither event happened. It was time for action.

The pressure was on. With over 80 percent of the chapter below the legal drinking age, it would be tough to defend using the dues of 100 percent of the brothers and pledges for the benefit of 20 percent of the brothers. Most any jury could easily see what would happen. It was only a question of time before a tragic event would occur and a lawsuit ensued. The chapter's legal position would be indefensible.

The Delts Talking About Alcohol program taught us that "quantity and frequency" were the paramount problems with college-age student drinking habits. Using chapter funds to buy kegs of beer only added fuel to the fire. Delta Zeta needed to be part of the solution, not part of the problem.

To say that the new policy was viewed by the chapter with mixed emotions would be in error. The feeling was unanimous. Who were these guys dictating how to spend money? But cool heads prevailed, and the chapter has carried out the new mandate—and survived. It was especially difficult for the officers. They had to face their peers on a daily basis, yet answer to the House Corporation.

Despite the difficulty, there have been "positives" from the new policy. Some female students have told some of

the brothers that they enjoy coming to the Delt House because they are not "hassled" by men too drunk to realize what they are doing.

Last August I visited the shelter for a "late night" party. The courtyard was packed. Everyone appeared to be having a good time. After about one hour, I left and visited another nearby house. The living room was packed with people dancing. The dining room had guards checking identification at the door. Inside there were about 20 men in various stages of drunkenness, singing dirty songs, falling down, and having a "good" time. Beer was splashed on the floor. It was interesting to note that the people in the living room did not go to the dining room, and visa-versa. In other words, they were having two parties, one for the drinkers and one for

the others. I wondered who bought the beer?

The "struggle" at Delta Zeta is not over. There still are brothers who remember "the good ole days" when the beer flowed. But in another year they will be graduated and we will have only members who know about the current system. At a university, it only takes three years to establish a tradition.

Will this work? You bet! As pointed out in the Delt Creed, "I believe in Delta Tau Delta as an abiding influence to bring about that happy life . . ." Delts Talking About Alcohol can contribute to that influence. I encourage alumni to join others in their ranks who are backing this important program.

Like several other participating alumni, I have attended Delts Talking About Alcohol. This has had an effect on me, both in wanting to help make it work at undergraduate chapters, and in my own life. I now limit my consumption of alcohol to two drinks or less a day, period. With a former partner dead from alcoholism and a family member suffering with the effects of too much alcohol, I have seen what it can do. I don't want this to happen to me, nor to the young men in our Fraternity. ▲

**K**ARNEA 1990 was four years in the making, and a host committee of Idaho Delts proved the claim that their state indeed was ideally suited for the Fraternity's biennial international gathering. The group, headed by Moscow attorney James Westberg, *Idaho '74*, had assured a 1986 Karnea delegation of that fact when making a surprise bid for the 1990 event. Amidst competition from major cities, they had won delegate approval for the somewhat remote site of Coeur d'Alene Resort in the northwestern tip of the state.

The result was a memorable Karnea attracting large numbers of Delt families, in addition to the undergraduate and alumni delegates, many of whom combined the convention with western vacation trips. Attendance at the Karnea Banquet, used as a measure of participation, was 750.

Chairman Westberg and his committee were cited in a Karnea resolution for the extraordinary effort over a long period of time that went into assisting with accommodations and planning an ex-

citing series of "extracurricular" events in the beautiful lake setting.

Undergraduates and alumni cooperated with excellent attendance at general business sessions and 50 seminars, many of which were held in early morning and late evening hours during the busy four-day period of August 15-18. The overall Karnea program was coordinated by Patrick J. Gibbons, *Cincinnati '84*, the Fraternity's director of program development, assisted by chapter consultants and other members of the Central Office staff.

Through daily business sessions and committee meetings, delegates elected officers and established policies setting the pace for Fraternity activities during the next two years. With Chicago already established as the site of the 1992 Karnea, delegates chose Atlanta for the 1994 event, after alumni from that city staged an imaginative presentation unequaled in Karnea history.









## Alumni Achievement Awards

### JAMES J. KELLY

*DePauw '54*

After graduating from Rushville, Indiana, High School, Jim Kelly took the advice of a friend, Fred Tucker, Jr., and enrolled at DePauw University on a scholarship. Following his graduation, he served for three years with the Air Force, then joined Goldman Sachs & Company in Chicago. He became a general partner in 1961, serving in that capacity until 1979, when he opted to be a limited partner, a position he continues to hold today. Mr. Kelly gained widespread notoriety by heading DePauw's Sesquicentennial Fund Campaign in the late 1980's. Described by others who took part in the effort as a one-man driving force, he led the way in raising more than \$110 million without the use of a professional fund-raising organization. This was, and is an all-time record for schools of that size. In the course of the campaign, DePauw bestowed its Old Gold Goblet Award upon Mr. Kelly for "eminence in life's work and service to alma mater." He has served as a member of the DePauw Board of Trustees for 11 years and is the current president of that group.

### LAURENCE WILLIAM LANE, JR.

*Stanford '42*

From 1985 to 1989, Bill Lane served as United States Ambassador to Australia and the Republic of Nauru, capping a long record of service to our country. He has served in high positions through appointments by Presidents Reagan, Carter, Ford, Nixon, and Johnson, including ambassador-at-large and commissioner general of the world's first international ocean exposition held in Japan in 1975. Yet, he is equally well known internationally as co-chairman of Lane Publishing Company, the Menlo Park, California publisher of books, films, and *Sunset Magazine*. A native Iowan, Ambassador Lane moved to California as a child and attended Pomona College before transferring to Stanford, where he received his degree in journalism. During a career

that actually started with selling *Sunset* door-to-door while he was in junior high school, he has received many awards for achievements in both journalism and public service. Several of the latter are in recognition of his long-time efforts in projects focusing on environmental protection and conservation. Ambassador Lane remains active also in advisory roles for Stanford, the University of California, and the University of Hawaii, and he is on the Northern California Committee for Radio Free Europe.

### GARY G. MICHAEL

*Idaho '62*

Born in Laurel, Montana, Gary Michael attended the University of Idaho on a scholarship. After graduating in 1962, he served for two years as an Army officer. Following his discharge, he worked for two years in the international accounting firm of Ernst & Whinney, then joined Albertson's Incorporated as an accountant. During the ensuing years, he progressed through several accounting and finance positions, including controller, to senior vice president of finance and executive vice president. He also was responsible for the company's food and drug stores for five years, in order to gain operating experience. In 1984, Mr. Michael was elected to his present position of vice chairman and chief financial officer, with responsibilities for all real estate, design and construction, finance, accounting, legal, human resources, and management information systems. He is a Certified Public Accountant and a member of the Company's Management Committee and Board of Directors.

### WARD L. QUAAL

*Michigan '41*

Even before he graduated from high school on the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, Ward Quaal had three years of experience as an announcer, writer, and salesman for a Marquette radio station.

While he was a student at the University of Michigan, he was on the staff of WJR, Detroit. That early dedication to his profession is indicative of the success that has made him one of the nation's best-known figures in radio. Now retired from the presidency of WGN Continental Broadcasting Company and head of his own management counselling firm, Mr. Quaal can look back on a radio and television career that has produced innumerable top awards. Among them are the top award of the Illinois Broadcasters Association recognizing "Lifetime Achievement in Broadcasting"; a National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences Governors' Award; the Distinguished Service Award of the National Association of Broadcasters; 1973 Illinois Broadcaster of the Year; five honorary doctoral degrees; and dozens of other honors. 
### ALAN E. RIEDEL



# Pictures that speak for themselves



**A**S A YOUNG boy growing up on a corn, bean, and diversified livestock farm in central Iowa during the 1940s, Dave Nagel learned to work alongside his father in an era when oats and hay were harvested with shockers, pitch forks and threshing machines.

"My dad is only 20 years older than I, so it was somewhat like growing up together," he recalls. "When dad was 27 and I was seven, he was farming 240 acres, milking 20 cows twice daily by hand, and feeding 500 sheep, 250 hogs, 50 cattle, and 200 laying hens. I remember milking cows beginning at that age, and getting up before school to feed livestock and break ice with an axe to water them."

Although his father, Orville Nagel, was a progressive farmer and an early tractor owner, he also used horses and "hired hands" to work the land in a dawn-to-dusk schedule. The farm didn't get electricity until Dave was nearly ten years old, and the Delt house at Iowa State University was the first place he lived that had indoor plumbing.

Living at the end of the school bus line, and therefore spending about two hours each day on the bus, as well as helping with farm chores left almost no time for athletics. Consequently his sports interests developed later in life.

Orville and Elnora Nagel placed great value on good scholarship and school participation, however, so their oldest son (Dave has two younger brothers and a younger sister) became active in 4-H, church youth groups, Boy Scouts, and student government. In high school he participated in speech competition and debate, igniting a long-time interest in what he refers to as "friendly argument." His parents always expected their children to be good scholars and conduct their lives with hard work, integrity, and service to others. They also added to their children's interests and enjoyment by taking them on trips through the Western U.S., Canada, and Mexico.

The Fraternity's new president has never sought an office. Yet, when encouraged to be a candidate he has nearly always responded positively. Through that process, he became president of his high school senior class, the 4-H Club and various youth groups, president of Delta Tau Delta's Gamma Pi Chapter, chairman of the Iowa State Student Senate, and a member of Cardinal Key, the University's senior leadership honor society.

Since graduation in 1963, he has served the Fraternity as Gamma Pi

House Corporation president, vice president and president of the Western Division, international secretary, treasurer, second vice president, first vice president, and now president. He has, in fact, held more Arch Chapter offices than anyone else in the history of the Fraternity.

Early in a banking career that began after receiving his B.S. Degree in political science and economics, Mr. Nagel was encouraged to participate in a Banking Toastmaster's Club and soon progressed to being a finalist in an American Bankers Association public speaking competition. An organizing director of Brenton Bank and Trust Co. in Des Moines, he has been president since 1973.

Mr. Nagel has received graduate school of banking degrees from four universities, and has lectured at various banking seminars. He has been president or chairman of a Rotary Club, his

In addition, she has traveled with me extensively visiting many chapters, and we share an interest in cooking, traveling, and hosting foreign exchange students and visitors. We're both very proud of two daughters, Mara and Tiffany."

Mara, 18, entered Iowa State University this fall as an honors program student with interests in the education of pre-kindergarten children. She speaks Icelandic and German, has written several published poems, and missed the Toronto Karnea only because she was on a foreign exchange program in Iceland.

Tiffany, 15, a high school sophomore, may be the Fraternity's youngest female Karnea "Hound," having attended her sixth Karnea this summer. She speaks Japanese and is self-learning Portuguese to use as a Rotary foreign exchange student in Brazil beginning in January 1991.

"I am very appreciative of my parents, wife, daughters, business colleagues, fraternity brothers, and community associates who have been responsible for the great experience and opportunity that life has given me," President Nagel says. "Over the years, a lot of people important to me have said to spend as much of your time as possible looking up, not down. That's been good counsel."

**A**FTER 16 CONSECUTIVE record-setting years with regard to the Annual Deltfund, we must report that we did not surpass or equal the \$421,000 received last year. One gift last year was far in excess of \$25,000 and if we had received a comparable gift this year, we would have exceeded our goal. But we are able to report that 5,380 Delts gave over 6,100 gifts totaling \$407,600!

During this past fiscal year your gifts enabled the Foundation to:

- Assist in the purchase of five chapter computers
- Implement Delts Talking About Careers on a pilot basis—the Fraternity's career counseling program to benefit undergraduates

- Continue support of the Resident Academic Adviser training program
- Continue support of the Fraternity's academic program by funding the cost of publication of "The Delt Academy" and the companion "Assist"
- Assist in funding of Division Vice President conferences
- Continue support of providing leadership and ethics speakers at Division conferences and at Karnea

In addition to the programs listed above, the Foundation also supported several other Fraternity educationally-related programs and is expecting to be in a position to conduct a pilot Delt Leadership Academy in June 1991.

Seattle Seahawks linebacker **DAVE WYMAN**, Stanford '87, had knee problems during the exhibition season and began the 1990 season on injured reserve. Detroit Lions linebacker **ROB HINCKLEY**, Stanford '90, was placed on the reserve/non-football injury list. Commentator **PAT O'BRIEN**, South Dakota '70, is now a regular on CBS-TV's "The NFL Today."

Among leading Delt collegiate players this fall are Stanford kicker **JOHN HOPKINS**; Stanford offensive lineman **CHUCK GILLINGHAM**; Nebraska middle guard **PAT ENGELBERT**; Brown co-captains **REID SMITH** and **GREG PATRICK**; and DePauw co-captains **KRIS GRUNER** and **ROB BUSCH**. Look for a full report on college standouts next issue.

**BILL LAVERONI**, California '70, joined the San Jose State staff this summer and serves as outside linebackers and specialty teams coach. He was offensive line coach at his alma mater from 1983 through 1989, then worked at UCLA during spring practice this year.

**JIM PARADY**, Maine '83, is now coaching the quarterbacks at Northeastern University after a two-year stint at Brown. He also was an assistant coach at Syracuse University for two seasons after coaching at both Colby and Hamilton.

Outfielder **WALT HARRIS**, Stanford '87, was with Rochester and Hagerstown. Catcher **DOUG ROBBINS**, Stanford '88, also was with Hagerstown while first round draft pick **MIKE MUSSINA** of Stanford ended the year with Rochester after going 3-0 with Hagerstown.

Other Delt in pro ball (primarily Class A leagues) were pitcher **BRIAN KEYSER**, Stanford '89; infielder **FRANK CAREY**, Stanford '89; outfielder **JACK HOLLIS**, Stanford '89; pitcher **BRIAN DARE**, Texas '90; outfielder **PAUL CAREY**, Stanford '90; infielder **TIM GRIFFIN**, Stanford '90; infielder **TROY PAULSEN**, Stanford '90; and pitcher **STAN SPENCER**, a Stanford senior.

The leading hitter for Team USA this summer was junior outfielder **DAVID McCARTY** of Stanford, who hit .445 (49 for 110). He also led the 25-13 USA club in doubles (13) and triples (6) while ranking second in RBI (31). Junior catcher **TROY TALLMAN** of Stanford also saw action for Team USA.

Longtime big league scout **DON DUNKER**, Indiana '42, has had an interesting career in the game. Now the New York Mets associate scout for the state of Indiana, he was with the Cincinnati Reds for 15 years and also served the Dodgers, Astros and Royals as a scout. While an undergrad, Don was a star righthanded hurler and Big Ten MVP. He later played a number of pro seasons in the Cubs organization before becoming a high school coach and teacher.

## BASKETBALL

In his third season as Assistant Director of Public Relations for the NBA New Jersey Nets is **JOHN TUDHOPE**, Bowing Green '88. While still in college, he worked as an intern for the Nets then was hired as a sales account executive by the club after graduation. John assumed his current duties in November of 1988 and is in charge of publications, player appearances and photography.



He finally decided to go through rush, and was fortunate in that the same two fraternities he became most interested in, were also interested in him. These were the Deltas and one other fine national fraternity. Andrew said he really liked and respected the members and possible pledges of both. The Delt chapter at W & L is relatively small. We discussed the contribution he could make to the Deltas by getting in there and helping them build it.

It was fun to visit with them and hear of their pride for the chapter. They are fine men. And I met some fine pledges that night.




**Small World**
