

To the 83rd Karnea:

rothers, it is my distinct honor and pleasure to report to you the accomplishments of the Fraternity for the past two years. In doing so, I would ask you to view this not so much as a report of the President, but a report of the leadership of the Fraternity. I have served on the Arch Chapter for fourteen years, and I can say unequivocally, that your current Arch Chapter is the finest group of men with whom I have worked, and they have all been involved in creating our success.

When we gathered in Atlanta two years ago, the Fraternity was faced with declining membership, burgeoning insurance costs, and a serious financial deficit. I am pleased to report that we have successfully addressed those issues and have created a strong foundation for the Fraternity to move into the 21st Century.

Shortly after the Atlanta Karnea, the Board of Directors and the staff

met in Indianapolis to design a comprehensive strategic plan for the Fraternity. That plan, consisting of a Mission Statement, a declaration of Values, and a delineation of specific, measurable intended results was adopted by the Arch Chapter and Undergraduate Council in January, 1995. It has formed the foundation for everything we do in Delta Tau Delta and has allowed us to overcome adversity and create new opportunities for service to our members and growth for the future.

We have organized our planning into six distinct long term accomplishments, and I will use these to highlight the accomplishments of the last two years.

We Create Opportunities For Our Members To Learn and Live Lives Of Excellence

Delts Talking About Alcohol is the fraternity world's premier alcohol abuse prevention program, developed by Delta Tau Delta 10 years ago. Over the past two years, this program has been presented to 64 chapters and 1,200 of our members.

Two years ago, we chose the Adopt-A-School program as our national philanthropy. Fifty-two percent of our chapters now participate in Adopt-A-School serving hundreds of school age children across the nation.

The Fraternity's Leadership Academy was started in 1992. Today we have twice as many applicants as we can admit to the Academy and are in the process of planning for a second Academy each year and regional Academies for the future.

And finally, through the leadership of former Northern Division President Greg Kazarian, we developed the Annual Achievement Agreement which helps every chapter plan and track its accomplishments during the program year.

Our Chapters' Operations And Programs Reflect Our Commitment To Excellence


This marks the first year we have accredited our chapters according to operating standards set by the last Karnea. We are very pleased to report that 65% of our chapters passed the accreditation. The other 35% have only slight improvements to document to achieve accreditation. What this accreditation process has done is allowed us to

determine which chapters need additional services in a timely fashion. It helps ensure that each of our chapters is capable of delivering a quality Delt experience to all of our members.

Secondly we have developed a comprehensive risk management program for the Fraternity. This policy focuses on the responsibility of the individual member to avoid behavior that poses a danger to himself or others. We are pleased to report that, since the implementation of this program, the number of serious incidents that have been reported to our insurance carrier has decreased by 50%. That, gentlemen, is a significant improvement and you all are to be congratulated for it.

We Are A Growing Organization

It is no secret that the fraternity movement has seen a drastic loss of members in the past six years. Delta Tau Delta is no exception. The good news is that we seem to have stemmed the tide. Our low point was 1994 when only 2,547 men were pledged to Delta Tau Delta. This year we pledged 2,600. Not a dramatic increase, but it is moving in the right direction. This turnaround is due to the tremendous leadership of Second Vice President Tom Huddleston, and our two key staff members, Kevin Johns and Ned Gustafson. They have led the Fraternity in conducting 23 rush clinics, recruiting seven new colonies

and installing three new chapters, with three more scheduled for installation this fall.

In addition to low rush numbers is a more insidious and serious problem, and that is retention. We lose one out of every four men we pledge before initiation. That is were the real danger lies. Increasing rush numbers is not the only answer. We must be smarter in our rush choices and we must deliver on what we promise.

Next year we will focus on those chapters with low rush numbers and low retention rates to assist them in upgrading their rush and pledge programs, and, we will create five new colonies. Carl Brantley, our Southern Division President said it best: "There are a lot of fine young men out there that deserve to be members of Delta Tau Delta." He's right. Our challenge is to find those young men, tell them the Delt message: that this is a Fraternity Committed to Lives of Excellence, and provide them with four years of the best programs and leadership opportunities we have to offer.

Our Membership Is Committed To Life Long Involvement in the Fraternity

We have had tremendous success in this area. In 1990, then President Dave Nagel, announced an initiative to provide alumni support to all of our chapters. It is the Delt 2000 program and its goal is to recruit 2,000 alumni by the year 2000 to work with our chapters. We started with a base of some 1,300 alumni and have expanded that number to over 1,800. At this rate, we will achieve our goal well before the turn of the century. Congratulations go to Secretary Merlin Dewing, and his Delt 2000 committee for their fine work. The exciting news is that we have embarked on a new initiative to further involve alumni in Delta Tau Delta.

Here at this Karnea, we have created the Delt Alumni Association. This group will be charged with fostering relations among the alumni, keeping them in touch with the chapters, and providing a new source of leaders for the Fraternity. Vice President Dave Hughes has been instrumental in developing this program and will guide it through the first two years.

We Are An Academic Leader In the Fraternity World

The numbers speak for themselves. We are first on campus in grades in one out of six campuses. Seventy-two percent of our chapters are above the All Fraternity Average and 57% are above the all men's average. Over one third of our chapter rank in the top three fraternities on campus. This, gentlemen, is a tremendous record. Our congratulations go to all the chapters who have raised the banner of excellence on their campus, and particularly to Brother Bob Roush for his leadership.

We Are a Financially Vital Organization

Shortly after the Atlanta Karnea, it became clear that we needed to restructure our financial systems and policies. To do this we recruited our first finance officer and began a review of all of our finances. The news was not good. Not only were we in a deficit for the current year, we had a number of accounting changes to make for past vears in order to accurately reflect our true financial position. The result was that we declared a \$600,000 loss for the fiscal year ending July, 1995. While that was bad news, it also had a silver lining. It allowed us to begin the new fiscal year with financial integrity and budget for the future using real numbers.

One of the key components for this year's success was the collection of delinquent house corporation loans. As you can see, this number has traditional been around \$500,000. We have reduced that to a little over \$200,000, and I guarantee you that number will be a lot lower in two years.

It was not an easy

year, and a lot of tough financial decisions had to be made. I am pleased to report that we have just finished the 1996 fiscal year in the black, and we have done so with a solid \$190,000 net gain. In real dollars, that is a \$400,000 turnaround from the previous year.

Congratulations and sincere thanks are due to Treasurer Steve Chandler, our finance officer, Duane Wimer, and Executive Vice President Ken File for their tremendous efforts in leading this effort.

We Are a Seamless Organization

This is our commitment of service to our constituents. It is our promise that every active member of the Fraternity understands their role and has the education, materials, and ongoing support to fulfill that role: be it as an undergraduate, chapter advisor, division vice president, Arch Chapter member, or staff. Most of our efforts have centered on powerful divisional meetings, and training of alumni volunteers and training of staff. We committed to training all of our division vice presidents last year, and we did that. This year we will train 50% of our chapter advisors, beginning at this Karnea, with a major training program. In addition, we have moved into the world of the Internet with our own home page. Behind the design is a commitment to all of our members. especially our chapters, to supply them with up to

date information now, not three or four weeks from now. Dr. Bob Roush, Jeb Blake and Jase McCarty deserve a great deal of praise for creating our electronic future.

Finally, your Arch Chapter is determined that you will receive the services you need. Next vear, for the first time, we will mail to you a scorecard and ask you to rate our response to your needs. Our commitment to you is that we will achieve a 80% satisfaction for the services we are delivering by the end of the year. We will listen, and we will adjust to ensure that you are receiving the services you need.

These represent significant accomplishments over the past two years, and a solid foundation for even greater accomplishments next year and the years to come. However, we have several significant and immediate challenges. The first is to ensure that the business systems and practices in the central office are sufficient to support the programs of the Fraternity and meet the needs of our chapters and members.

The second involves a very positive change for the Fraternity. Ken File our Executive Vice President left that post to become the Educational Foundation's chief fund raiser. While that will provide a tremendous boost to the financial health of the Fraternity, it leaves a very real hole in our staff leadership. Secretary Merlin Dewing is heading the search process and will be submitting a final list of candidates to the Board. Obviously this is the most important decision the Board will make, the selection of the chief executive who will lead us into the next century.

Gentlemen, I want to thank you for the oppor-

tunity and privilege to serve as your President for the past two years. It has been an exciting and very positive experience. I would like to once again thank all of the members of the Arch Chapter, the central office staff, our alumni volunteers and to each of you for your hard work, dedication, and your very real commitment to lives of excellence. It is truly what has made Delta Tau Delta the great Fraternity you see today.

Many years ago, I worked for a Presbyterian Church, and we had a number of elderly parishioners, one of whom was 85 years old. Her name was Eloise Stenzel. One day on her way out the door of the church I asked, "How are you?" and she said, "I'm better." My response to her was, "Oh, I didn't know you had been sick." And she says, "Oh, no, I haven't been sick, I'm just better." As I look back on my service on the Arch Chapter, which began in 1980, and indeed ever since I was pledged to Delta Tau Delta in 1963, I can truly say that each Delt experience has been better.

I think that is what this Fraternity is all about, that we offer that kind of an opportunity to every one of our young men. I believe that there is a flame that is given to every human being that is brought into this world. But some, through adversity, some through circumstance, and some through neglect have let that light die. We, in this room, are very fortunate. We are here because someone nurtured that flame for us, and we are, in large part, able to nurture that flame for ourselves.

I believe it is the mission of this Fraternity to nurture that flame and guide each one of us to a life of excellence. Not for ourselves alone, but because we are here, as Carl Rowan put it, to be that \$20 bill and nurture that flame for another human being.

I would like to thank the members of the Arch Chapter, the Central Office staff, and all of you for all the hard work you have done, and for the love and support you have given me over the past two years. I wish you not just success, but that each and every one of

Legacy for the Future

THE KARNEA ADDRESS OF DAVID HUGHES

PRESIDENT-ELECT

t gives me a great deal of pleasure to appear before you tonight as the President of this great International Fraternity. For this honor, I want to thank you, and say that I am deeply humbled. And I want to assure each and every one of you, without hesitation, that I will discharge the responsibilities of my office with the greatest diligence and vision that I can muster. To do otherwise would be to disrespect the efforts of all of those who have come before me, a number of whom are in this room tonight. Perhaps even more importantly, to do otherwise would be to do a great injustice to our undergraduates who deserve our very best.

Let me speak briefly at the outset of my remarks of my Delt pedigree, as sometimes it is garbled by well-meaning folks.

I'm the son of a Delt, the

grandson of a Delt, the grandson of yet another Delt, the great grandson of a Delt, the brother of a Delt, the brother-in-law of a Delt, the cousin of a Delt times six, and the nephew of a Delt times two. Beyond that, my brother, Donald, is married to a wonderful lady whose brother is a Delt, whose father was a Delt, and whose grandfather was a Delt. Years ago my father's sister married a Phi Delt, and when their son went off to college at DePauw, he pledged Phi Delt. Well, my father and his brothers got together and sent their nephew a telegram indicating to him that they thought that was a very noble sacrifice for him to make on behalf of his father. When I went off to college at Ohio Weslevan, my Dad sat me down and said words to this effect: "David, I just want you to know

that you are free to pledge any Fraternity you wish." Then, after a long pause, he added: "But I also want you to know that if you pledge Delt, I will pay your tuition all the way through college and law school!"

It is touching to me that at this Karnea, several individuals have come up to me and told me some wonderful stories about my grandfather and father, neither of whom ever missed a Karnea to my knowledge. And these stories about my grandfather have been remembered despite the fact that my grandfather has been gone now for almost fortyfive years. In addition, it is poignant to me that I should ascend to the Office of President here in Washington, because this was my grandfather's home for many decades and also was my father's home when he was an undergraduate Delt at Ohio Weslevan.

Moving forward to the present, I want to sincerely thank the Presidents of this Fraternity under whom I have served, Dave Nagel, Norval Stephens, and Jeff Heatherington, for their excellent stewardship, leadership, and vision for the future. And I must say the very same for the work of Ken File as Executive Vice President of the Fraternity. I also want to thank the Arch Chapter for their dedication, their service, and their lovalty, both now and in the future. The very same can be said for the members of the Board of Directors of the **Educational Foundation**

and for the loyal and dedicated staffs of both the Fraternity and the Foundation, and to their families that sacrifice much so that the Fraternity may prosper.

Let me speak to you briefly tonight about the direction that the Fraternity will take over the next two years, and what the role of all of you in that regard must be.

First, as most all of you know, Ken File is leaving his current position of **Executive Vice President** and is moving over to the Educational Foundation. You may rest assured that this Fraternity will select as its next Executive Vice President, to fill the very large shoes of Ken File, a person possessed of all of the necessary skills, values, experience, and vision that are needed to propel this Fraternity into the next decade as a leader in the Greek World, and as an innovator in that World. That person will share, and will be firmly committed to, our Mission and to our declared Values that we know are imperative to the continuing vitality of our organization. In the meantime. we have an interim leadership team in place that will perform admirably.

Second, our Fraternity will remain committed to the academic achievement of all our undergraduates, which has been a hallmark of ours since our founding 138 years ago. You already are aware of the fine work of our immediately past Director of Academic Affairs, Bob Roush, in this regard. Seventy-two percent of our

chapters are above the All Fraternity Average; one out of six chapters are currently first on campus academically; thirty five of our chapters ranked first, second, or third on their respective campuses. But we can do even better than this, and we will. In this day and age when the earning of a college degree is no guarantee of either immediate or long term employment, academic achievement by our membership is cardinal to our Mission. Thus, we intend that eighty percent of our chapters be above the All Fraternity Average, and one out of five chapters first on campus academically. And we will achieve those results.


Third, the Fraternity's undergraduate chapters will continue to be laboratories for leadership. Our emphasis in rush, pledge, and member education will remain that we are Committed To Lives Of Excellence and to our core Values. Our undergraduate programming will continue to include that theme, and our chapter consultant program will be further refined to both model and to achieve that commitment. So, too, will our chapter advisor, academic advisor, and house corporation programs. And, with the fine assistance and support of our Educational Foundation, our Leadership Academy will be grown and kept entirely relevant and cutting edge.

Now, let me speak directly for a moment or two to our alumni. Delta Tau Delta needs your continuing support, concern, and your time and effort. And, unlike the 60s and 70s, the undergraduates of today in America and Canada want the assistance of its graduated brothers. They want to know what you have learned: (1) how to successfully complete an education; (2) what course work they should pursue to enhance their employment opportunities; (3) how to interview for a job; (4) how to apply successfully to graduate or professional school; (5) how to progress in a job. After all, the college men and women of today read the same statistics that we do: (1) that corporate America is downsizing at the rate of 2,600 jobs per day; (2) that 62% of all start-up businesses fail within the first six years; (3) that competition for graduate and professional schools is at an all-time high; (4) and, as I said, that a college education, in and of itself, no longer provides a guarantee of a well-paying job coming right out of school. They want your interest and your assistance. So, we must deliver to our undergraduates the great promise of our Delt 2000 Program, namely, to have 2000 alumni actively involved on the undergraduate chapter level by the year 2000. And, to give even greater assurance to the success of that program, we have announced at this Karnea the creation of the Delta Tau Delta Alumni Association. Patterned after the college and university model, our Alumni Association will be man-

aged by a board of directors of twenty five alumni. The first group of directors likely will be appointed within a few weeks. Among many other useful things, the Alumni Association will support the work of the Housing Commission, will support the work of the Delt 2000 program, and will do all within its power to foster the growth and vitality of our alumni club program. A number of you will be



directly to our undergraduates. There is one particular responsibility that I want to talk to you about for just a moment. And I call it the awesome responsibility of the

called upon shortly to commit your time and talents to this new Association, and I know that the Arch Chapter will be able to count on your support.

Now, let me speak

undergraduate fraternity man. The awesome responsibility of the undergraduate fraternity man. What do I mean by that? Just this fall there will come into your home, and it is your home, 10 or 15, or 20 or 25, or 25 or 30 young men 17 and 18 years of age. These young men have left their families behind, and they have come into your home. In a sense, you have become their parents.

Now, what kind of a home are they going to find with you? These young men are in the most impressionable stage and age of their lives. What kind of an atmosphere are they going to come and live in? Will it be a home and an atmosphere which will be conducive to the building of their characters and which will tend to bring out their hidden powers and their hidden potentialities and the strong possibilities that each of them possesses as human beings? Or will it be the type of home and atmosphere that will degrade them and, perhaps, reduce whatever potentialities and what-

Lady of the Fraternity. ever possibilities they had as young men? Well, that decision, to some degree, rests upon them. But believe me, brothers, the decision and the outcome rests largely in your own hands, and there isn't any question about it.

When my father was President of this Fraternity precisely forty years ago, there was a question that he would always ask the undergraduates when he would speak with them, and it went like this. "What kind of fraternity would my Fraternity be, if every other Delt were just like me?" Let me repeat that if I may. What kind of a fraternity would my Fraternity be, if every other Delt were just like me?"

And finally, let me speak directly to the other members of your newlyelected Arch Chapter. Gentlemen, I challenge each of us to continue to perceive the correct vision of the desired future of this great organization. First, let us continue to pursue excellence in all of our work for the Fraternity. Second, let us realize, and then communicate effectively, what

makes us singular and unequaled. Third, let us continue to be "forward looking" and pro-active in our thinking about this Fraternity so that we can project ourselves ahead in time in our planning. Lastly, let us be able to describe our desired future in such images that we are able to convey to our

undergraduates a mental picture of what things will be like when they get to their intended futures as Delts and as young men. Let them be able to picture the possibilities.

Let me conclude by quoting the last paragraph of the Report of the Committee On The Future Of The Fraternity at the 1996 Karnea, "The Committee is in full agreement with the Arch Chapter, all officers, and the Central Office staff that the most important job we all have, and really our only job, is to enhance the lives of Delts to the best of our ability." I heartily agree with this sentiment and dedicate myself and the Arch Chapter to keep this principle uppermost in our thoughts and actions.

The first such awards were presented at the Pacific Northwest Karnea in 1966 to a distinguished quintet of alumni, who came to Portland from the corners of the nation to accept this recognition from their Fraternity. Now, three decades later, alumni have again been tapped as worthy recipients for the Fraternity's highest professional honor. Following are brief sketches of the recipients of both awards, citing either their achievements in their fields of endeavor which have brought honor and prestige to the Fraternity or chronicles of their lifetimes of Fraternity service.




Alumni Achievement Awards



D. DUANE CUMMINS, PhD

A 1957 alumnus of Theta Founding Chapter, Dr. Cummins has served since 1988 as President and professor of American History at Bethany College. He spent ten years at Oklahoma City University where he was Chairman of the Department of History, curator of the George H. Shirk Oklahoma History Collection, Director of the Robert A. Taft Institute of Government and Director of the Division of Continuing Education. In addition to earning the PhD from Oklahoma University in 1974, he was awarded the LL.D. from William Woods College and the HUM.D. from Phillips University. Dr. Cummins is the author of eleven books and numerous articles dealing with American history and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). His churchmanship has been widely recognized.



HENRY C. "RIC" DUQUES

Mr. Duques is Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of First Data Corporation (FDC). Duques graduated from George Washington University in 1965 where he was a member of Gamma Eta Chapter. He holds a bachelor's degree in Business Administration and the MBA in Accounting and Finance, both from George Washington. Prior to joining FDC, Mr. Duques was President and CEO of the Data Based Services Group with American Express. In 1989, American **Express Information** Services Corporation was formed and Duques became its first president. ISC was renamed First Data Corporation in 1992 in anticipation of an initial public offering which was subsequently completed the end of that year. FDC is a leading provider of high-quality, high-volume information processing and is traded on the New York Stock Exchange.



ROBERT E. FEIDLER

Born, raised and educated in North Dakota, Mr. Feidler's career has been in the legal field, both domestic and international. He served in all three branches of the Federal governmentthirteen years with the U.S. Senate in senior staff capacities and seven as the head of the Federal Courts legislative, intergovernmental and public affairs department. He gained a national reputation in areas as diverse as court reform, civil and constitutional rights, bankruptcy, tax and intellectual property law. His vears as an officer in the Army Reserve included decorated service in the Gulf War and later in Northern Iraq. He has been President of several legal and military associations or institutions and received numerous honors for his service and leadership. After entering the private sector, Mr. Feidler focused primarily on international solvency issues both as a consultant to the U.S. government and foreign entities. Mr. Feidler is a 1971 alumnus of Delta Xi Chapter.




M. MARLIN FITZWATER

For the next decade Hood held vice presidential offices at Pullman, Inc., rejoining McDonnell Douglas in 1982 as Vice President-Program Development and Marketing. Mr. Hood is currently President and a member of the corporation's CEO office of Douglas Aircraft Company. He currently serves on the boards of numerous organizations including the McDonnell Douglas Finance Corporation, the California Chamber of Commerce, the Los Angeles Chapter of the American Red Cross, and the Los Angeles Music Center.



TIMOTHY P. JOHNSON

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate, Mr. Johnson also received the M.A. in political science and the Juris Doctor degree from the University of South Dakota. He is a 1969 alumnus of Delta Gamma Chapter. In 1975 he began a private law practice in Vermillion, combining it with an impressive political record which began with election to the State House of Representatives, and after serving two terms, he was elected to the State Senate. After eight vears in the State legislature, Johnson was elected as South Dakota's only member in the U.S. House of Representatives. He is an active member of numerous policybased organizations, and as he enters his fifth term, he continues his commitment to creating positive change and building a better future for his constituents. 
JOHN H. ROHRBECK

An Historic Installation

KARNEA PARTICIPATES IN THETA RHO CHARTERING

arnea attendees had the chance to participate in an opportunity that happens only rarely—the actual installation of a new chapter during the Model Initiation.

Under the watchful eye of Larry Altenburg, George Washington's chapter advisor, a combined Ritual performance team from both GWU and American University presented a literally flawless installation rendition of the Ritual and oversaw the literal birth of a new chapter. It was to thunderous applause that, at the ceremony's conclusion, the neophytes took their seat as the Charter Members of Theta Rho.

The chapter's history stems back to one fall 1994 morning four pledges of a local University of Dayton fraternity met with the fraternity's actives. The discussion focused on their differences of opinion about the local fraternity's values and direction. That particular meeting was the beginning seed of

Theta Rho Chapter even though it was not known at the time that Delta Tau Delta would eventually enter the scene.

Bryon Crump, Victor Perez, Jeff Shaw, and Rob Perani, the four pledges, decided that there was a significant void in the University of Dayton's Greek system. Their local fraternity didn't support the values, ideals, and commitment to excellence that they desired. These four



soon de-pledged the local fraternity with three more pledges, Adam Chiappetta, Matt Hosterman, and Mark Salvador, joining them. The seven decided that they wanted to start a a new fraternity so they approached the university's Greek affairs office with this proposal. Several meetings were held with university officials over several months and with persistence from these seven young men the university approved their request and titled the seven as a University of Dayton special interest group.

All that lay ahead was to receive approval from the Inter-Fraternity Council. This proved to be a more difficult task than obtaining approval from the university. The fraternities were wary of approving a new fraternity which they viewed as simply adding competition to the existing fraternities. The IFC, therefore, denied approval on the first attempt, but the seven young men were again persistent. They individually met with each fraternity president and stressed that their quest for a new fraternity wasn't primarily to cause competition but was to strive for greater fraternity excellence at the University of Dayton. Their point was that they would help to strengthen the overall Greek system. On

the second attempt the IFC gave unanimous endorsement and approval. Delta Tau Delta was still not in the picture as yet.

Delta Tau Delta, in the mean time, was talking with University of Dayton officials about the prospect of establishing a colony, perhaps in 1997. John Hancock, then the Fraternity's director of membership and expansion, had been in contact with the University of Dayton. In early 1995, the university asked John to present Delta Tau Delta to the University of Dayton's Greek community including to several members of the UD special interest group. John presented the Delta Tau Delta Mission and Values and discussed and answered questions about the overall organization and chapters within Delta Tau Delta. The special interest group knew right away that Delta Tau Delta was the fraterni-





ty they wanted to bring onto UD's campus and join. The university approved Delta Tau Delta to establish a colony, not in 1997 but in 1995.

In the mean time, John organized a Dayton area Delt alumni meeting and invited them to discuss the establishment of the Dayton colony. More than twenty alumni attended the first meeting. A dozen of them ultimately committed to directly support the colony while several others pledged their support to back up the dozen.

In September 1995, Ned Gustafson and Kevin Johns from the Central Office pledged the original seven plus an additional 37 other UD men who each committed to support the mission and live the values of $\Delta T\Delta$. On October 6, 1995, the University of Dayton Crescent Colony of $\Delta T\Delta$ officially came into existence.

The University of Dayton was founded in 1850 by the Roman Catholic order of Marianists. Current enrollment is 6,500. There are more than 70 academic programs in four schools;

arts and sciences, business administration, education, engineering and engineering technology. There are ten sororities and fifteen fraternities on campus. The university is a member of the Atlantic Ten Conference for division 1 sports and the Pioneer League for division 1-AA sports.

Be Someone Else's Twenty-dollar Bill

came here with a little trepidation because I was asked to speak on "family values." I guess I'm qualified to do that since, last week, I had my forty-sixth wedding anniversary. You know, that's a long time to eat the same woman's cooking.

But I would not always have been qualified to talk about family values because I grew up in a family with a lot of dysfunction, one of the reasons being there was no money in it. Don't you ever forget that the lack of money has an awful lot to do with values and the breakup of families.

I make more money in a day than my daddy ever had in any year when he died at the age of 94. I remember those days in McMinnville, Tennessee, at the height of the depression, when he was making twenty-five cents an hour hauling lumber, if he had any work at all. There were no food stamps; they'd never heard of welfare in McMinnville, Tennessee.

Nobody in my family had ever graduated from high school, let alone, from college. One of the great things I was learning in those early days was from an uncle, who was a bootlegger, who would laugh when the cops came and searched the house for whiskey and went away, having failed. He would show me how smart he was by taking down the pipe from the stove and show me how he had his whiskey inside the pipe. Once, he took me out, laughing, and showed me how he buried it under the stack of wood for the winter.

I was one lucky guy to get a chance to learn something better, primarily because I had a mother who did have a great sense of values; no graduation from high school but she knew the value of learning and she knew the value of making youngsters proud.

We'd sit by that kerosene lamp at night and she'd be going through the arithmetic and she would say to me often, "There isn't anybody in that school who is any smarter than you are," and I believed it. That made a tremendous difference in my life and when I put my seventy seven cents in my pocket and went to Nashville to take a job at a dollar a day at a TB hospital to get the money with which to go to Tennessee State, I realized that she had instilled something in me about values that would never go away.

There was a teacher, Miss Francis Thompson, at Tennessee State, an art teacher—they never heard of art in my little Jim Crow school in McMinnville. So what do they do? They put me in that art class and I'm scared to death. On the first day, she gives us all a piece of paper and says, "I want you to put on that piece of

paper the grade you expect to get in my class."

I summoned up all my courage and I put down a big "C." She rippled through the papers and said, "Would Carl Rowan from McMinnville, Tennessee raise his hand."

I stuck my hand up. She said, "Would you stay just for a moment after the other students have gone?" I said, "Yes, ma'm."

She said, "Were you surprised that I knew you were from McMinnville? Would it surprise you if I tell you every grade you got in high school?"

I said, "No, ma'm."
"You didn't get any "Cs"
there, so why did you put a
"C" on the piece of paper?"

I just sat there—dumb and frightened.

She pulled open her desk drawer and said, "I want to read you something."

She read me some words written by a man named Daniel Burnham in 1925:

"Make no little plans. They have no power to stir men's blood and probably, in themselves, will not be realized. Make big plans in the hope that they'll become a thing of burning intensity."

She handed me another piece of paper and I put a big "A" on that piece of paper! I can tell you that no student worked harder to earn her student an "A" than Miss Thompson worked for me.

Values. Family values. Where do you get them?

Well, you've got to get certain kinds of *opportunities* to hold and to nourish certain kinds of values. That's why I'm happy to be here—knowing that *you* are doing the kind of volunteer work—trying to give people the kind of help they need to sustain the values that you and I cherish.

You know, I can

assume that I'd be just this kind of guy because God gives certain kinds of people values and he doesn't give other kinds of people values and I know that's nonsense. You've gotta get some breaks along the way. And you've got to understand how some things that are so terribly political and controversial go into the business of conferring values.

Would I be sitting there listening to that lovely introduction talking about 56 honorary degrees but for some tremendous volunteer help and for some breaks along the way? No way! Affirmative action is one of the greatest debates in America today. I don't hesitate to tell vou that I'm here because I am a child of affirmative action. I went on to college-I was doing graduate work in journalism at the University of Minnesota when, at the time of getting my degree, I turned to my dean and I said, "Where in the name of Heaven will I get a job?"

In this country, in 1948, you could count literally on the fingers on one hand, the number of daily newspapers in America that were giving black people full time jobs. Dean Casey said, "Hell, I don't know but the first thing you gotta do is try right where you are. Go over to the Minneapolis Star and Tribune and see if they'll give you a job."

I went in and the people in the personnel office gave me every test but a pap smear. Then the woman said, "We don't have anything open. If we get anything we'll phone you."

I walked out with smoke coming out of my ears thinking "They've done it to me again." I got on the street car and went back to St. Paul where I was renting a room. But when I got to the corner of University and Avon where I was to get off, I looked out and there was my landlady huffing and puffing. She'd run four blocks to tell me to go back across the street and take a street-car back to the *Minneapolis Tribune* because the editor, Mr. Gideon Seymour, wanted to talk to me.

Well, I went back. I got a job. And later I would find out that one day the publisher, a man of great conscience, John Coles, had walked into the newsroom and realized he was looking at a sea of white faces. He went to his editor and said, "Gid, you'll never convince me that in all these United States you can't find a Negro man or woman capable of being a reporter on my papers."

He built a fire under Gideon Seymour with his affirmative action. And Gid built a fire under the personnel officer. I didn't know it but when I walked out of that personnel office he picked up the phone and called Gid Seymour and said, "Mr. Seymour, one of them just came in!"

There are a lot of ways to do something *affirmative* for someone in the promotion of social justice and family values.

I was sitting reading the Washington Post in 1987 and I saw a story that they were holding Honors Day at Coolidge High School and when they called the names of the black kids that had made the honor roll they wouldn't stand up. They didn't want their peers to know that they'd studied and worked hard enough to make the honor roll because the peers were saying that if they made the honor roll they were acting

"white" and if they spoke and wrote good English they were using "white" language and this bothered me *profoundly*.

I said "We've got to have some way to counter this negative peer pressure. There have got to be some rewards for those youngsters who strive toward excellence-who will have the nerve to stand up to the know-nothings. Maybe we ought to have a scholarship program that gives special honor to these youngsters" and I put up sixteen thousand bucks of my own money and hoped my friends would match it.

In 1987 we could give eight four-thousand dollar scholarships to those students who dared to excel. Well, to my amazement, my friends more than matched it. One of your fellow Delts, Bernie Swain [George Washington '65] and his partner in the Washington Speakers Bureau, Harry Rhodes, threw in a substantial amount of money. By scholarship dinner time, I had \$208,000 and gave fifty-two voungsters four thousand dollar scholarships.

Well, we've beaten the know-nothings because in this town high school seniors today fight to win a Project Excellence scholarship. That program has grown to the point where last May, we gave 103 kids four million dollars.

Now let me tell you something. Family values is where you *find* it and where you *make* it. We never mention poverty in Project Excellence. I take the view that we're celebrating *excellence*—not poverty. I tell kids, "I can't tell you that I'm going to give you a scholarship because you're poor—I'm telling you that if you go out and bust your butt, hit those books and

keep your noses clean, we'll get you a scholarship; we'll get you a future."

One young man, four years ago, had been nominated by his school. A young man from a background of no privileges, no previous college experience and his freshman and sophomore grades were a little lousy because he had not yet found the real values of life. But we had \$120,000 scholarship at the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Sciences to give away. I noticed that this young man, in his last two years, had straight A's in all the sciences. When he came, (every one of these nominees has to give a speech before ten judges) I sat and listened to that young man. I, and some of the other judges, decided that he had a potential far greater than his overall

GPA. We called him back and talked to him and we gave him that \$120,000 scholarship. He went to Boston; in the first year, they chose him as president of the freshman class. In terms of grade point average he finished Number One. At the end of his freshman year, they decided he was so brilliant in chemistry, they hired him as a college-wide tutor. On top of all that, he became the campus barber, giving kids a free haircut on their birthdays and charging them five bucks a cut the rest of the time. An absolutely marvelous young men who's just about to graduate, he's already been accepted at six medical schools.

He's got a sense of values today so different from when I first saw him four years ago that you cannot believe. That is

arl T. Rowan is one of the most honored Americans in the field of journalism, publishing, civic leadership and public service. He has served his country as naval officer, ambassador to Finland, and director of the U.S. Information Agency at the height of the Cold War. He is the only journalist in American history to be awarded, by his peers, the covet-

ed Sigma Delta Chi medallion in three successive years for domestic reporting and foreign correspondence. Mr. Rowan was enrolled in the Sigma Delta Chi Hall of Fame and the Black Journalist Hall of Fame. In television he received the top-ranked Peabody Award and Columbia University's Silver Baton for his specials on Africa and Thurgood Marshall. He is completing his 26th (and last) year as the senior panelist on Inside Washington. He has received 56 honorary degrees from distinguished institutions around the country. For his civic endeavors, Rowan has received numerous honors, especially for founding Project Excellence, a scholarship program design to reward black high schoolers who dare to excel in learning, writing and speaking. Since 1987, Project Excellence has provided almost \$9 million in scholarship aid to some 700 college-bound black youth. During his boyhood in then-lim Crow McMinnville. Tennessee, Carl Rowan hoed bulb grass for 10 cents and hour, graduating to mowing lawns for 26 cents an hour. Because of his race, he was forbidden to enter the town's only library. Still, he graduated as valedictorian of his high school class. He scrubbed porches in a TB hospital to earn money with which to enter Tennessee State College in Nashville. While there, he passed a nationally competitive exam, in 1943, and went on to become one of the first fifteen black Americans ever to become commissioned officers in the U.S. Navy. After World War II, Rowan used the GI Bill to get a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Oberlin College, and a master's degree in journalism from the University of Minnesota.

what public service is all about. That's what it's all about when you do what you do—and you must do more of it. But we must not deceive ourselves into believing that volunteer efforts and private help will meet all the compelling needs of this society.

You know, I hear all the political talk about how we've got to wipe out the Welfare State because the Great Society was a total failure. I was in government in 1965-I sat and drank whiskey with Lyndon Johnson night after night when he talked about how he was going to push through a Federal Aid to Education Act and he pushed it through because he felt strongly about it. He talked about how he went to a "crappy little college in Texas"—that he didn't go to "Hah-vuud like the Kennedys"- that's the way he put it. He was going to do something for all the kids that wanted to go to a crappy little college like Southwest Texas State. Well, you know what hapEducation Act in 1965, the number of American children going to college has tripled and I'm not just talking about black kids or Hispanic kids or kids that go to Southwest Texas State. Kids that come from middleclass families and even richer families have benefited from the Pell Grants and other programs that put college within their reach. If you tell me that we aren't better off because we've tripled the numbers of people that can go to college then I'll know you're nuts.

Let me say to you that you talked about some of the nice things that have happened to me. I want to tell you a little story by way of talking about what really bothers me most in the great social debate in America. The things that bothers me the most is the cliché, "You don't solve problems by throwing money at them." They remind me of the spring day of '43 when I stood on the steps of the administration building at Tennessee State saying good-by to my buddy, Joe Bates, because I didn't have the twenty dollars with which to pay the next quarter's tuition.

"Hate to see you go, buddy" he said. "Before you go, walk with me to the greasy spoon."

So I walked with him to the little campus restaurant. It was closed. We turned to walk away and we had to cross a dirt circle where the dinky bus made its u-turn. The students would get off and throw away their green transfers, always a zillion lying everywhere. We started up the walk and something said to me, "Carl Rowan, one of those green wads you just passed in the weeds was not a bus transfer.

I went back, picked it

up, rammed it in my pocket, and said, "He, Joe, I just found some money and it didn't look like a One!"

When I got behind the hedges, I opened it. It was a twenty-dollar bill!

I quickly surmised that some student, on his or her way to pay tuition, had lost it. I said, "Joe, I just pray to God that whoever lost it doesn't need it as badly as I do."

I walked into the administration building and paid my tuition for the next quarter. Three days later, so help me God, I was sitting in the history class of professor Merle Ebbes when, apropos of nothing, he ran in and said "Carl Rowan, come with me to the Dean's office."

My heart creased my scalp. I walked into the Dean's office and Ebbes said, "Dean Gore, here is the young man who's going to volunteer to join the Navy." I said, "I ain't volunteering to join any Navy," and he said, "Yes you are!"

Dean Gore said,
"Please, please professor.
Young man, are you aware
that in the entire history of
the United States there has
never been a Negro officer in
the Navy?"

I said, "Yes sir."
He said, "Are you
aware that here at all-Negro
Tennessee State, we often
get messages from
Washington intended for
the all-white University of
Tennessee at Knoxville?"

I said, "No, sir, I didn't know that."

He said, "Well, we got this telegram from the Navy," and he read it to me, "'NATIONALLY COMPETITIVE EXAM. NAVY OFFICER
TRAINING. HOPE SOME OF YOUR STUDENTS WILL TAKE EXAM.' I sent this back—'DO YOU REALLY MEAN US?' I got this back, 'YES, WE MEAN YOU.""

He said, "Now we don't want Tennessee State embarrassed. *Somebody* has got to pass that exam. I've asked Professors Ebbes and Boswell to give me the names of two students they think might pass and Dr. Ebbes has chosen you—a marvelous testimonial from your professor. And I know, that out of *loyalty* to your professor and *loyalty* to your college and *loyalty* to your race..." and I said, "Yes sir. I volunteer to join the Navy."

Well, I did pass and I did go to Midshipmen's School and I served on a couple of fleet tankers in the North Atlantic as Communications Officer. I want to tell you, that was the great break in the life of a green, country kid from a little red-clay town in Tennessee I'll never forget.

When I went back to see Gid Seymour he said, "Oh I've looked at your grades—they're magnificent. But what impresses me is that they let you be the guy to get up at three o'clock in the morning to decode those messages from the commanding ship or from Washington. I figured Hell, if they can trust you to do that, I can trust you to be a reporter."

I know there are some Horatio Algers out there in this audience who are saying, "Yeah, but don't forget, Rowan, you had to pass the test."

I say, "Of course! You never read a word I've written that didn't preach preparedness."

But let me remind you. I wouldn't have been at Tennessee State so I could have taken the exam if I hadn't found the twenty-dollar bill.

So when you're talking about volunteer work and social policy, *never forget* that what *this* fraternity gives may be *some* kid's twenty-dollar bill. And that, in our own self interest, we can *never* afford to take those twenty-dollar bills away.











(which kept Jim on location in Russia for six months) and "187" starring Samuel L. Jackson.



*Hanna Barbera drawing storyboards, creating licensing art, and designing characters. Baker was born in Des Moines, IA, the son and grandson


of accomplished Iowa artists. He studied graphic design at Iowa

Triumph through Tragedy Reporting from Ground Zero of the Oklahoma City Bombing.

t 9:02 am Wednesday, April 19, Randy Cassimus, Florida '82, was jolted out of his bed onto the floor by what he thought was a huge thunderclap—as if the tree just outside his house had been struck by lightning. "Wow! Big thunderstorm," he thought-not an unusual occurrence for April in Oklahoma. He figured he had better get moving to get to work in order to deal with KWTV's standard severe weather coverage.

After showering he returned to his bedroom and opened the curtains, only to see a bright sunny Spring morning shining in. "Wait a minute-no severe weather? What was that huge, bone-rattling

noise?" he thought.

He turned on the TV and his heart leapt into his throat as he saw the live aerial picture of a devastated downtown building which was being reported to be a federal government office. "Oh, my God!," he thought, "my wife works for the federal government downtown!"

The big shock wave was not a lightning bold outside his house but had been a bomb blast eight miles away! It took Cassimus just a frantic moment to recognize that the damaged building was not his wife's office and he attempted to call her as he hurriedly dressed. He got no connection because downtown phone service had been partially knocked out. He sped to work where he would essentially live for the next two weeks.

As far as his role in the reporting of the Murrah Building disaster, he was responsible for staffing the production crews, and he was one of three people who took equal shifts directing KWTV's live local breaking news coverage which went non-stop around the clock from 9:04 am Wednesday until 7 pm the following Monday-130 hours of continuous live, locally produced, commercialfree, programming-free coverage during a period of unspeakable community-wide shock, stress, and wrenching grief. Even "off-shifts" weren't really "off." Cassimus and his team worked at whatever tasks that were necessary-from relieving other staffers at their posts, to

answering the flood of phone calls, to helping with the parade of citizens pouring into the station with donations of everything imaginable. Cassimus says, "I am not a native Oklahoman, but I honestly have never been more proud of anything in my life than just being part of a community in which the citizens responded so selflessly to such a horrible situation."

The next Saturday,

they learned that President Clinton would be coming to town for a large memorial service to be held Sunday at the state fairgrounds arena. Knowing he would have to cover the event, Cassimus spent the next several hours rounding up staff, equipment and other resources to help televise the service. He worked all night setting up his remote equipment in order to be ready for the 10am security sweep as dictated by the Secret Service. Throughout the setup, he was on the phone with CBS, trying to work out the logistics for them to be able to take his signal. Surprisingly, despite the sea of media in town, his was the only outfit who had live multicamera switching capabilities inside the arena—so everyone else wanted to piggyback on his production. As it turned out, he was able to feed not only CBS but also put the memorial service up on the satellite for free use by anyone in the world. About half the CBS affiliates in the country took it live, and the rest aired it delayed a few hours and fronted by Dan Rather.

(He even heard from friends that had seen it in Italy).

Cassimus produced and directed the telecast of the two-hour service featuring President Clinton and Rev. Billy Graham. By the end of the touching memorial, he and his entire dedicated, professional staff were attempting to do their jobs through streaming tears. He was calling camera shots unashamedly choking back sobs. After the service, after the teardown, Cassimus got to go home to sleep—over 40 hours since he had last been able to do so. He later joked that "stressed, distraught, and sleepless for two days" was just how he had always wanted to direct his first live national telecast!

The silver lining for Cassimus would come in October when he received an Emmy award from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for producing and directing the Murrah memorial service. The award was presented by Today Show host Willard Scott

Cassimus says that he would obviously, gladly return the award in exchange for being able to turn back the clock prior to 9:02 am April 19 when 169 of his neighbors perished at the hands of terrorists. He says, "Mine is an odd business where great honors are bestowed and careers are made as a result of others' terrible tragedy. We just work hard at our jobs and try not to think about it." ■

When GW's water polo coach insisted that the Colonials could compete on a national level, perhaps even with elite teams from West Coast schools, some thought he had his head in the clouds. But the proof is in the pool and on the sheet of paper that shows George Washington's rankings rising fast. "It's a slow and steady process," said Delt junior Brent Stoll, who entered the season third in team history with 195 career goals. "Ten years ago, I'd say, 'Maybe never,' if someone asked if we could compete with West Coast schools. But more and more good players have come here." Stoll started the influx of talented Southern Californians when he arrived from Lake Forest, CA, having chosen GW over UCLA. He said he didn't want to redshirt and sit on the Bruins' bench for a year or two, and he didn't want water polo to overwhelm his life, no matter how much fun he had playing it. "Here I can balance more things, school, my social life, internships," said Stoll, a finance major. Stoll says it was really hard at first when the team was losing but with a recruiting class that included Stoll and Delt Peter Clifford, who arrived from St. Louis, they began to turn the program around. Their coach says, "Here they can make an impact. I told them, 'You're not going to have to redshirt. I don't want to see you after four years. I want you to go to school, get out and get a life."

hen Yale named 34-year-old Carm Cozza, Miami '52, its head football coach in 1965, athletic director Delaney Kiphuth declared, "The future of Yale football is in very capable hands."

To which Cozza said, "I'll be happy to be here all my life."

Neither realized how prophetic they would be.

Now 66, Cozza began his 34th season this fall, and 32nd as head coach. And the last for the winningest coach in Yale's storied 124-year football history.

In announcing his retirement in conjunction with the scrimmage with Plymouth State, Cozza said, "I just wanted to clear the air...whatever I decided, I didn't want them to read about it in the papers."

Cozza, the dean of Ivy League football coaches who boasts a 177-111-5 record (.613 winning percentage), has become synonymous with Yale.

He joined Yale in '63 as a backfield coach to John Pont, a teammate, roommate and coaching colleague at Miami (Ohio). Two years later, when Pont left for Indiana, Cozza succeeded him.

> Cozza learned football under Ara Parseghian and Woody Hayes at the University of Miami, and has had to make many,

young men. I've had some 2,000-plus players (including five Rhodes Scholars) and, of all those who have stayed with the program, only seven have not gotten degrees that I know of."

Cozza held his final lunch at New Haven's Mory's on November 19. It had been a tradition, Tuesday lunch at Mory's, the private eating club on York Street, where photographs of Yale athletic captains line the walls and the names of more than a few former Bulldogs are carved into the dark wooden tables.

No one remembers precisely when Cozza first started hosting his weekly meetings with the media at Mory's, but it's hard to imagine a Tuesday without one. He ended his career with "The Game"—the annual classic between Yale and Harvard.

"It's been an emotional time, obviously, for me," Cozza said. "Being the last game, standing on the sidelines for the last time...People keep asking me how I think I'll feel. I don't know. But I'm sure I'm going to have an empty feeling, win or lose."

The old white house that is a home to Mory's looked almost bereft after Cozza left that Tuesday afternoon, and his office—once overflowing with trophies and plaques, photographs and small mementos—now resembles a senior's dorm room in the midst of graduation week packing.

many adjustments during his years at Yale. But the basic philosophy of his program—the Ivy League philosophy of academics first, athletics second—has never changed.

"He was truly, truly what I believe college sports is all about in an age when there is so little perspective on the game," said Stone Phillips, Yale's quarterback in 1975 and 1976 now an anchor on "Dateline NBC." "In terms of keeping perspective, Carm always was one to do that. He loved to win, he wanted us to win, and he did everything in the rules to help us win. Nevertheless, he always encouraged us academically to be as competitive as we were on the athletic field."

During this, his final season, Cozza has received gestures of appreciation from many peopleamong them President Clinton and former presidents George Bush and Gerald Ford-but the messages he has received from his players have touched him most deeply. "So many people tell me that football was the most important course they took at Yale," Cozza said. "That means a lot to me."

"He was a great coach and a great mentor," Phillips said. "And I think the success of so many of his players off the field is a tribute to him."

Delt Dies in Tragic TWA Crash

wo weeks before, Richard G. Campbell, Ohio State '55, was in Columbus, relaxing with friends at the 45-year reunion of the North High School Class of '51. He joked about buying a car for his 16year-old son and retiring in a few years from his job. Campbell, 63, of Ridgefield, CT, died July 17 when TWA Flight 800 crashed into waters off Long Island. He was the plane's flight engineer. "We were more like brothers than friends through college," said Don Kindler of Upper Arlington. (He and Campbell had been pledge brothers at Ohio State.) "I was concerned when I first heard it was TWA-I've been hoping all day it wasn't him. It hit me pretty hard [when I found he was on the flight]. I'm going to miss him." Campbell left OSU and became an Air Force pilot. In 1966, he joined TWA as a pilot. Campbell is survived by his wife and two teenage sons. At presstime, the cause of the crash is still under investigation.

had just completed a twelve month **English** instruction contract in Korea. I had learned the basics of the Korean culture and the all too recurring theme of fragmented details that signify Korean communications. I had two choices: go further or go home. Remembering to put my Delt letters into the back pack, I pressed further. I had scheduled a three week tour into unexplored parts of Asia. This meant visiting Taiwan, Thailand and China. My journey started with a departure from Seoul, Korea.

My first stop was Taipei, Taiwan to view the economic activity that I had read so much about in Western business journals. In addition, I wanted to visit the National Palace Museum, depository for the majority of mainland China's cultural treasures and antiquities, and rated as one of the top five museums in the world. The museum brought out the true essence of Asian culture and the rich history of a world unfamiliar to most of us in the West.

My next country of adventure was Thailand. It I spent the first few days in the northern city of Chiang Mai, a small town known only for its tours into the jungle surrounding it. One of the reasons I was there was because I had heard that one could charter an elephant, but also buy a bamboo raft down river the way local tribes had done since the beginning of their settlement in the region. The local Karen hilltribe was a

tribute to just how diverse the world had become. I was visiting with people that had never developed a written language. I thought about how, over the past year, I had missed the fast face of American capitalism.

I spent the rest of my time in Thailand divided between the city of Bangkok and the beach community of Pattaya. Bangkok is a city trapped between the poor planning of the past and the lure of investments from the development world. The city is most noted to travelers for its temples, or wats to the natives. I had the fortune to attend a ceremony at Wat Phra Kaew while the King of Thailand gave Buddhist followers a seasonal message of goodwill. Each wat was adorned with gold, precious stones and religious statues depicting the creation of the Buddhist world and the Rama leaders of Thailand.

My last week in Thailand was spent resting on the tropical sands of Pattaya. A beach city southeast of Bangkok, Pattaya offered every pos-



sible beach sport including jet skiing in the waves of Asian seas. I got a scorching tan to carry me into China.

On August 7, I flew north over the flooded lands of the world's most populous nation to set down in the city of toured the street markets in search of live snakes. I wanted to eat fresh snake. To no avail, I ended my search with a traditional Chinese meal of duck. My final destination in Asia was Hong Kong. I wanted to revisit the city and say that I had been there in



Beijing. Tiananmen Square and the Summer Palace were the city's attractions. I also went to the Great Wall, where I sported my Delt pride. In fact, I ended up trading my Delt T-shirt to a vendor for a Great Wall souvenir. My second Chinese city on the tour was Shanghai, an ancient city that was once the center of the Orient. Shanghai is now experiencing an economic rebirth.



Delt On Tour



The End of an Era

t was after midnight of the last night of his 32 years in the state Legislature, but even as the clock was running down, Newt Russell, USC '50, had not run out of questions.

Oblivious to the antsy legislators milling about awaiting their getaway, the veteran senator from Glendale, CA, rose and posed a query that was incomprehensible to anyone who had not read the fine print of the matter at hand.

It was a quintessential Newt Russell moment.

In a career spanning three decades, the rockribbed, fourth generation California Republican always read the fine print and made a career out of tending to details others eschewed.

Moreover, Russell's reputation was as impeccable as his exacting work habits, and when he left the Capitol at the end of his session in November because of term limits, he received bipartisan accolades for his integrity and his character.

Talking to people and achieving consensus was

Russell's way. As the leading expert on pensions, Russell's legacy to the state includes an actuarially sound state pension system, which he guarded against excesses till the end.

The Russell prescription for consensus involved an open process where everyone got together and had a say, "instead of plotting, planning and power plays," said state pension specialist David Felderstein.

Although the 69-yearold Russell is as baffled as anyone about why he took on such an arcane specialty, he recalled that "it always bugged me that bills would come up granting a pension to some nice bureaucrat but with no analysis of costs."

Pensions were not Russell's only unusual specialty. He was also known as the "conscience of the Senate," a title bestowed on him by colleagues for his dogged efforts to keep the Legislature as free as possible from procedural shenanigans and sleight of hand.

Russell was in the family insurance business when he got the political bug after volunteering in Nixon's 1960 campaign. After narrowly losing his first Assembly bid, he was elected in 1964, becoming a member of a freshman class that included legislative legend and now San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown.

When a safe GOP congressional seat opened up in 1968, Russell sought to move up but withdrew from contention at the behest of Gov. Ronald Reagan, who prevailed upon Russell to stay in the Assembly, where Republicans had just gained a majority.

In 1974, after reappor-

tionment meshed two districts, Russell lost a bitter primary race by a few dozen votes. During that campaign, his opponent tarred Russell with just about the worst thing said about him during his career—that he was suspiciously friendly with the enemy. The specific charge was that Russell had gone on a vacation with a close friend, the current Assembly Speaker.

After characteristically rejecting bonus pay to "lame duck" legislators because he deemed it "improper that taxpayers should pay for services not rendered," Russell was out of office for just ten days before an opportunity arose.

A state senator had resigned midterm to become lieutenant governor and Reagan called a special election. Reagan repaid Russell for party loyalty by endorsing him in the primary, and Russell was soon back in the Capitol as a state senator.

A religious family man who steered clear of the lure of wine, women and song in the Capitol, Russell fought in vain to keep pornography off cable TV but succeeded in banning the manufacture and sale of drug paraphernalia.

When he was not legislating, Russell was often practicing his faith. Not only did he organize and hold together a bipartisan Wednesday-morning bible study group for legislators, he prayed for political friends and foes during

Beyond that, Russell was a "meat and potatoes" GOP legislator who carefully tended his bills.

When he was being wheeled in for heart-bypass surgery early this year,

Russell game directions until the last possible moment and called to check on his bills as soon as he was out of intensive care and had access to a phone.

Russell sees nothing unusual about such dedication, but is somewhat uncomfortable about publicizing it, claiming an "anathema to public breast beating" or otherwise seeking the limelight.

"It's just not my nature," he said.

Not that he is unmindful of the public impression he makes. Just the opposite is true.

"When people look at us, we're government," he said. "What they think of our conduct is what they think of government."

Despite his lengthy and rewarding tenure in Sacramento, Russell is a supporter of term limits as a safeguard against the trappings of office, though not the six and eight years that are now the law in California.

"The tendency unless you are careful, is to slowly come to the conclusion this place is run for our benefit and we're indispensable," Russell said. "It's awfully easy to rationalize how we conduct ourselves...in a way that wouldn't be understood by the public."

Russell acknowledges, somewhat ruefully, that he came to Sacramento thinking he would change the world. He will now settle for a more modest legacy.

"What I'd like to say is I've made things better because I've been here," he said. ■




Outstanding Recent Graduate Award

Prime Meridian-

Central Office Relocates to Circle City's Outskirts

In late October, the Fraternity's headquarters moved to 11711 North Meridian Street in the affluent Indianapolis suburb of Carmel (pronounced KAR-mel for our California brothers).

The decision to move was based on a number of factors, most notably, the available of a great deal more space at a more market-driven price. The new headquarters also includes extensive conference and meeting facilities and is adjacent to a variety of moderate priced hotels, enabling the Fraternity to better handle its training needs closer to home.

The Fraternity's Central Office was established by a vote of the Arch Chapter in New York City in 1913. For the meagre salary of \$100 per month, Brother Frank F. Rogers became its first executive secretary. On July 1, 1926, the Arch

Chapter authorized Frank Hemmick, Rogers' successor, to look for larger quarters and the headquarters moved to 285 Madison Avenue, Room 1111. Hemmick hired a new assistant, fresh out of Indiana University. His name was Hugh Shields.

In 1933, the Arch Chapter voted to move the headquarters to a more central location and Indianapolis, Indiana and Columbus, Ohio were investigated as possible sites.

Whether it was because of Shields' fondness for Indiana or perhaps because the deal was better, 333 N. Pennsylvania St. in Indianapolis became the new home.

In the post-war boom, as the economy grew, so did the Fraternity. When the work outgrew the capacity of the staff, an additional member was added. Eventually the amount of work and the

amount of people completely outgrew the space available. In the spring of 1953 a residential property at 3242 North Meridian Street was acquired. Through more than a year the planning, demolition and new construction went on. A good bit of the interior was gutted, although the exterior shell of vellow brick remained untouched.

The new building had three times as much space as the former rented quarters. On one side of the new headquarters was being built a new medical clinic—which was to contribute greatly to the health of our headquarters, but shorten its life.

By 1966 the medical clinic had acquired the whole block, with the exception of the Fraternity's property and the value of the headquarters skyrocketed. The Arch Chapter decided it was time to move and selected a beautiful Tudor mansion on Washington Boulevard, in what had become known as "Fraternity Row" because the headquarters buildings of several other national Greek organizations were there. While this was an elegant building and much larger and more adequate than the previous building, it proved to be a mistake. Three years later, property values began to decline and crime increase and the Central Office was again moved to rented space at 4740 Kingsway Drive.

As a result of many factors, need for a new site became evident in 1985, and in the fall of 1986 the office moved to somewhat larger quarters at 8250 Haverstick Road, still farther north in Indianapolis.

As the Central Office continues to adapt to better serve chapter needs, so too will the facilities and technology, to keep the Fraternity a recognized leader in the Fraternity world.



here's a bit of a play on words in this article's head-line. Proceeds from the Annual Fund provide almost 20% of the operating funds for the Fraternity. That's important for a number of reasons. I'd like to outline those for you as a further understanding to the importance of giving annually to your Fraternity.

For one thing, our young men are increasingly under financial pressure while they are in college. At some of our undergraduate chapters, almost 80% of the young men are receiving some sort of financial aid from their school and many are going to debt just to stay in school. It was for that reason that we committed to holding the level of dues to the level of inflation. That commitment made us put our efforts on the line to help our chapters rush more effectively to enlarge their size and also to expand the number of chapters so that we could contain the growth in our costs by spreading it over more chapters and more undergraduate members.

But that's negative thinking. On the much more positive side is the emphasis that the Fraternity has put on its mission and values. We have restated The Delt Creed in modern language and made it clear to our young men what it is we expect of them and what they should expect of brotherhood. The result is that we've seen some very positive developments at chapter after chapter.

I think our alumni have seen those improvements when they return to their chapters. Furthermore, we've got more and more alumni involved in the lives of our chapters, thanks to the growing contribution being made by the Delt 2000 program. This aims to put 2,000 active alumni at work helping our chapters grow and understand the responsibilities of manhood.

We've also improved the performance and efficiency of the Foundation office, enabling us to grant a higher percentage of our proceeds for the work of the Fraternity.

All of these factors are working together to persuade more and more alumni to contribute to the Annual DeltFund. The undergraduates increasingly look with respect to the alumni and are asking for

help in making career choices and in how to get started in business. The alumni now feel wanted and needed in the chapters. And the programs that the Fraternity is offering and the Foundation is supporting have caught the attention not only of Delts but of the fraternity world everywhere.

We can't forget that we're an educational foundation. That means we support academics. Hitting the books. Today the average grade point average of a Delt is 2.8 versus the average of all fraternities of 2.6. That's a huge difference. Twenty percent of our chapters are one of the top three chapters on their campus academically.

I was able to report to the Karnea the most successful year we've ever had. More than \$479,000 to the Annual DeltFund. In addition, we had capital gifts and bequests of \$171,000. These latter gifts go into our endowment funds and are not spent on operations. We have experienced growth from investment management in excess of 8% in recent years. We take 5% of the value of these endowment funds each year and use those funds for specific purposes. This is a very conservative way to manage money and allows us to grow our investments more rapidly than inflation and still provide the Fraternity with funds growing at a rate faster than inflation.

And where do the Annual Funds go?

- They provide half the cost of the Chapter Consultant Program, those visiting professors of leadership that hold seminars in our chapters twice a year for each chapter
- Leadership training at the Karnea for programs like Adopt-A-School and our Chapter Leadership Guide
- Funding for the Director of Leadership Development at the Central Office
- Funding for the fifth Delt Academy for twenty some top candidates from our chapters
- Educational program manuals to help with the development of management techniques and academic programs in each chapter
- Internships for continued delivery of our premier "Delts Talking About Alcohol" program

This report comes with the thanks from almost 6,000 undergraduate for the help that the alumni are providing not only to undergird their chapters but to provide them with the kind of leadership training that will stand them, their chapter, their communities and our countries in good stead in the future.

I hope you'll look for listings in this issue, and, if you see brothers who have not given, call them and urge them to do so. Your giving, and the giving of thousands of other brothers, has been the foundation of the growth of our Fraternity. Our Educational Foundation is just a group of words unless we all get behind it. With sincere thanks, I salute you for the support that you have given your Fraternity this past year.
